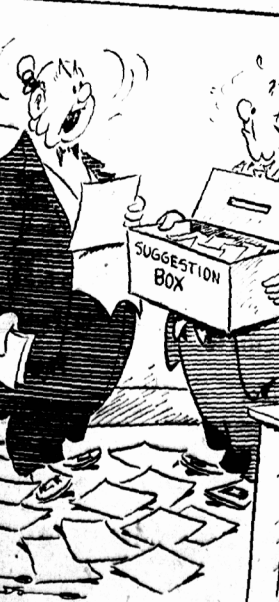

Canadian Wages in Manufacturing

OTTAWA, Jan. 17 (CP) - Average weekly wage of hourly-paid workers in Canadian manufacturing hit a record high of \$41.16 at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics announced today.

A new high figure for hourly earnings - \$6.5 cents - also was shown for the same date. The trend toward higher average hourly earnings in manufacturing is a result of the new wage survey conducted by the bureau.

The new Brunswick hourly figure was \$6.9 Nov. 1 compared with \$6.4 Oct. 1 and \$6.7 Nov. 1, 1947. The weekly average at Nov. 1 was \$39.71.

No figures were given for Prince Edward Island which has practically no manufacturing.
