PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

As A Summer Resort—Reached by Steamers of the Plant Line.

VERDANT AS THE EMERALD ISLE, WITH A SKY

Like that of Naples—A Land of Purest Water and Richest Cream, Hospitable Homes and Homelike Hotels, the Paradise of Bathers and Sportsmen.—By Miss E. W. MacMurray, Charlottetown.

Summer again with its bird-song and bloom, its high noon suns its dreamy skies, its mellow moons, its languid breezes and its drowsy airs. "Heyday," cries Nature; "Man," echoes "Holiday," while the sumptuous elegance of La Grande Duchesse entices the tourist from an over-heated, over-crowded civilization to the restfulness and rural freshness of our fairest Island home.

The thorn has scattered lavishly its petals; the fragile form of the violet has withered; the breezes of divinet June, redolent with a freshening fragrance, have borne away the snowy beauty of a myriad blossoms. Gradually has a mystic life pulsated and throbbled through an inert nature; gradually have a stupor and barrenness yielded to its silent rebreathing, and dormant beauty, loosened and unbound at Divine bidding has come radiantly forth.

What a witchery of loveliness, does nature weave. How the woods fairly revel in their midsummer carnival. What infinite grace and loveliness have clothed the long dismantled branches, how intricate a tracery marks the tender tissue of the luxuriant foliage; in what exquisitely varied forms does it flaunt its gala freshness, tremulous with a very ecstasy of life, as: "With a ripple of leaves and a tinkle of streams, The full world rolls in a rhythm of praise."

Our Island trees and forests are her glory. What beauty they lend to every roadside and rural lane and quiet nook; how they crown the hills with their gleam and glint and graceful outlines, and what a picturesque background for the varied verdure of sunny meadows. And what more charming spot when one has tired of the sun and his scorching ways, than a shady grove of lofty beeches, their darkened foliage a very canopy of coolness. The breezes, as they sway the ash branches, vary their wonted stifling caprices to more stately arias. The twitter one hears overhead seems tremulous, as if some feathered warbler were timid of so majestic a haunt; and in the dry mould at one's feet, if some wood nymph will graciously deign to guide one,—oh joy!—a purple-lipped orchid lifts its showy head.

The drives through our Island are everywhere charming, each landscape full of beauty and variety ever lending an added charm. Now, from the summit of some breezy hill, there fall on the view far-reaching bays "clear and blue as those of the Mediterranean;" now, in some quiet valley, cosy farm-houses nestle snugly in shady groves, and graceful birch and alder mirror themselves in the placid brook, where sportive minnows dart in glassy shallows, and the bubbling fountain gratefully ministers its refreshing waters. Now the roadway leads through some delightful avenue, where branching hazels and quivering aspens and queenly maples entwine their foliage in luxuriant fineness; and the air is full of the fragrance of odoriferous pines and balsamy firs and from the hedgerows, where trailing tendrils twine their purple blossoms, the gorgeous petals of the lovely wild roses exhale their exquisite sweetness—while everywhere, in graceful knolls, the dainty fronds of sweet-scented ferns carpet the woodlands with their delicate green and fairly fill the air with their de-

growth without an adequate effort of lung and muscle?

The cuisine of our hotels is good. An honest man, whose word very much I respect, but whose digestion is capricious, has assured me that no where on earth has he tasted any food so perfectly cooked, so daintily served and so nutritious as at his favorite 'resort.' Nature has made an ample provision for our larders. The fish that teem in our seas are the wonder and delight of the American; Island mutton has been pronounced by the epicurean as unrivalled; to the vegetarian our land is simply a paradise, while fastidious palates delight in the consommé, croquettes, chicken-pies, chow-chow, chowder and ice-cream of an ingenious culinary art.

The bed-rooms of our summer resorts are quite large, accommodating two good sized beds quite easily. These are usually arranged near the wall, at opposite ends of the rooms, leaving plenty of space to move about in. One can remember the time when it required quite an amount of courage to make one of a party of four, in a sleeping-apartment. The beds were entirely different from those now in use, consisting of an amount of loosely packed chaff, and reposing on wooden slats arranged horizontally, which yielded most ill naturedly to any caprice of their helpless victim. Thus in the middle of the night, if one felt one's tired limbs too closely in contact with some matted mass, and found a change of posture actually necessary instantly the slats groaned and creaked, rattled and screeched so, that three heads were at once raised from their pillows, and interrogation points, following hard after mice, burglars or a need of creosote, were hurled at one promiscuously. Nor did this end the agony, for in the morning one was sure to hear complaints of a severe headache, owing to a disturbed night's rest, or of the impossibility of sleep, for one at least, when once awakened. All this has happily passed away and the spring mattresses in use in our hotels respond so quietly and gracefully to every movement that one could exercise with dumb-bells at midnight, if desirous, without the least fear of disturbing the quiet repose of even one's neighbor.

Prince Edward Island is a land of peace and plenty, and sea breezes; of the purest water and the richest cream; of hospitable homes and home-like hotels; a land of singing birds and humming birds, and butterflies and honey-bees, where the verdure has been likened to that of the Emerald Isle, the sky to that of Naples, and the bays to the classic waters that wash Sicilian shores.

Any drawbacks our Island may have had as a summer resort nature has kindly removed. The reptile with the prodigious leap and four-inch sabre shaped teeth has happily become an extinct species, its fossilized remains awaiting our prospective museum. Wolves kindly defer their visits until a northern inclemency has made effort to bridge Northumberland Strait; wild cats seem to have tired of an insular habitat, while bears confine themselves entirely to the remote extremities and are reputed vegetarian. There, it is true a few mosquitoes found in some localities, but these appear to be a perfectly harmless variety, if one keeps out of their way. Of course if one is foolish enough to go ungloried and unvelled in the very barbed and needle-pointed jaws of some blood-thirsty wretch, one must pay the penalty; but if the face be well protected with a thick barenet veil, and one's costume of a substantial texture; if gaiters be worn at all times and long wristed buckskin gloves be kept well pulled up, mosquitoes will not be found the least troublesome. If you are a man and don't wear gloves and a veil, thrust your hands in your pockets turn up your coat collar and let your whiskers grow. The mosquitoes of our Island have been seldom known to interfere with a man's nose.

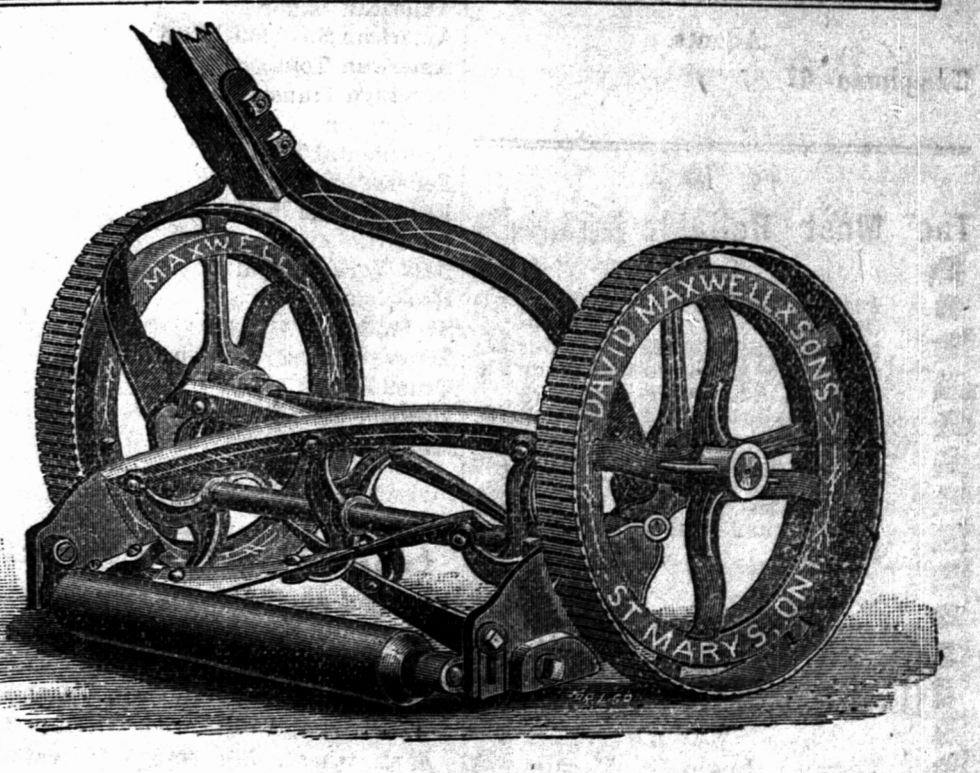
