**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**TORONTO, June 18 — (CP) —** All mining groups were heavy practically throughout today's Toronto Exchange session. The note was generally firm at the opening and the final hour brought a mild rally in the golds but the group was still down .80 at the close. Base Metal Stocks lost .47 and the West-ern Oil 46.

**NEW YORK, June 18 — (AP) —** Further strength of rails and assorted specialties lifted today's Stock Market average to another 8-year peak on one of the largest volumes of the year although declines among industrial leaders were widespread.

Tomorrow the Stock Exchange and other New York Markets will recess from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in honor of Gen. Eisenhower's visit to the metropolis.

Low-quoted issues came out in big blocks after the opening. Gains, ranging from 1 to 4 points at the best, were reduced before the close and losses actually were the majority. Transfers of 1,930,000 shares compared with 1,900,000 Friday and were the largest since May 7.

**MONTREAL, June 18 — (CP) —** Leaders in papers, industrials and utilities gave displays of firmness in transactions today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market as the generally stronger trends of last week were maintained. Papers and industrials were at new eight-year peaks in the indices.

St. Lawrence corporation "A" was the feature in trading, opening up 4 1/8 and closing with a net lift of 2 5/8. The Common was also ahead both ways at new highs.
