DERBY, England, Dec. 23—(CP)—Norman A. Ramsell was granted a nullity decree by a divorce court after hearing evidence that his Canadian bride, Gertrude Amelia Ramsell, nee Quinn, of Charlottetown, disliked England and refused to consummate the marriage.

Ramsell was with the Royal Air Force in Canada when they were married at Charlottetown May 21, 1943.

Within an hour or two of the wedding reception he had to leave for England.

Judge A.R. Willis said the hurried marriage caused a "remarkable state of affairs" when the bride later came to England.

The judge said Ramsell was fortunate in being able to get a nullity decree for refusal more rapidly than for desertion.
