

TIMELY CARE OF THE HANDS

With the frosts of winter at our doors it behooves the woman who has no maid to assist her in her household duties to look to her hands, if she would keep them pretty and soft in spite of her manifold duties about kitchen and dining room. For if the hands are in goodly condition when winter sets in, they will not be so likely to crack and chafe and roughen up when the really hard and trying weather sets in. This is the time not only to lay in a supply of glycerine and witch hazel—one of the very best of all softeners for the hands—but to apply it regularly. Each time the hands have been in hot dishwater or in the rinsing waters of vegetables or potatoes, they should be carefully washed and wiped, the cuticle gently pushed back from the nails, and glycerine and witch hazel—about two parts of witch hazel to one part of glycerine—well rubbed into the skin of the hands while the fingers are gently massaged up and down. It sounds rather a bother to be told this but in reality it is the simplest and easiest thing to do. Then at night before going to bed wash the hands thoroughly in warm water with a teaspoon of oatmeal and a pinch oforris root, use the nail brush going over the whole hand carefully and dry with a soft towel. When the hands are thoroughly dried take a good massage cream—not an ordinary cold cream—and massage the hands as gently as you would the face, going slowly over each finger and rubbing the cream into the cuticle. Rub until all the cream is quite absorbed. Any cream with cucumber in it is excellent for the hands as it has a tendency to whiten the skin. It is never well to wear gloves to sleep in for the hands do not need to be kept warm. If these directions, combined with careful manicuring, are followed, there will be a marked improvement in the appearance of the hands. But one thing is essential—that is, that creams and powders used on the hands should be of the very best, as poor creams will only do harm that it will take weeks to undo. As with everything else a little prevention is worth a pound of cure, and to prevent roughening and chapping is to go a long way towards keeping the hands in goodly condition throughout the season of cold and frosts.

The boarding of the foxes for this winter has been arranged for at a cost of not more than 1 or 2 p. c. of the value of the increase. In our own ranch the rearing will be done at the actual cost of feeding and looking after the foxes, not on a percentage basis.

The ranch has not been built yet but will be located near Charlottetown. Although the company already owns the foxes it was thought advisable not to start the construction of a ranch this year as it is too late in the year and to near breeding time and the shifting of the foxes might prove dangerous to results.

Negotiations are pending for the purchase of two more pairs.
