FEW MENDING TIPS

It's a good idea to keep your mending basket handy these days, for many a garment would give many months of extra wear if it were properly reinforced when the first signs of wear appear.

Lingerie slips that give at the seams can be reinforced with a length of white tape. Frayed straps often can be replaced with strips from a worn-out slip.

And here's a tip regarding wool dresses which have fallen prey to moths—pieces taken from the hem and set in under the moths holes will make a patch that is hardly noticeable. Wear in the garment's under-arm section can be repaired similarly and will not detract from the appearance of the frock.

While cracks or chips on enamel finish of razors and razors won't actually affect their performance, they are unsightly, and there's a good chance that in time the exposed metal will rust.

To patch the spots, get a touch-up enamel from your appliance dealer or from paint store. If it's already started eating away at the metal, sandpaper the chipped, raise and dry with a brush. Then wash it with little coal oil. Then use a small brush to cover the bare spot with the enamel.

TWO-PIECE FROCKS FOR DAY, EVENING

NEW YORK—In a fall collection of made-to-order originals, emphasizing quality, good taste, and unobtrusive beauty of line and detail, flattery was found in two-piece costumes for daytime and evening, whether simulated or genuine. In fact, long-skirted evening dresses trailed the soft, feminine lines of the dress with the suspicion of a sweep or just escaped them as black Jacquard, slim and narrow, worn with a jacket of quilted black tulle, its squares outlined and centered with bits of sparkling tulle.

Short-skirted, evening models were more frequent, and made up in brightness of detail and trimmings for their abbreviated length.

ON CLOTHES

Make at least two sets of collars and cuffs for any dress that needs them, and use them in rotation so that you don't have a last-minute scramble to wash, iron and air them.

Clip them in with press studs to save the sewing.

Seew loops of tape on to the band of all your skirts so that they can be hung up properly. This saves constant pressing, and makes for longer wear.

Keep your clothes brush scrupulously clean, and try damping the bristles slightly to remove stubborn fluff or dust from black materials.

Dedicate a quiet hour once a week to mending your personal clothes—stockings, shoulder straps, dresses. It saves the misery of discovering that you have nothing fit

to wear for a week-end with your sister-in-law.

Have your shoes mended as soon as they show signs of wear and don't wait until the heels have become worn down and through the shoes off balance.

Keep patent leather shoes, and bags supple and well fed with an occasional dose of vaseline to prevent cracking. Suede reacts nicely to brushing over steam with a rubber brush.

Steam takes out creases in materials too. Hang a tired-looking dress in the room whilst you're bathing if you want to wear it immediately and have no time for pressing.

MOTH FABLE

Moths do not prey on rayons, according to authorities. However, other insects, especially silver fish and often will be attracted to rayon with a starch sizing. Crickets, which many people think are a harmless household companion, may also feed on rayon. Rayons clothes stored with the ordinary naphthalene moth preventives will be protected from insects. If they are not so starched, there are special insecticides which should be used when the insects first appear. Some of the holes in rayon clothes which have been blamed on moths are actually caused by the insects which have been dissolved by a drop of nail polish or perfume.

SHAMPOO THE THING FOR BEAUTIFUL HAIR

NEW YORK, Oct. 8—(CP)—Your crowning glory is one of your best assets, so you owe it to yourself to keep your hair beautifully lustrous at all times.

Frequent shampoos are absolutely necessary, particularly if your hair is oily. If you live in a smoky city or work in a dusty area, the scalp has to be kept clean if hair tresses are to be healthy.

Since hair is an indication of health, diet and exercise are prime factors in keeping your tresses looking alive.

Before you shampoo brush your hair briskly with a good quality stiff bristled brush. Whatever shampoo is used should be the rich lathering type and one that will bring out the hidden highlights.

Perfect for the girl in the service and for easy packing are the new envelope shampoos. There is a natural shampoo for every color of hair: a henna shampoo for brunettes, a shampoo for blondes—all delicately scented with lavender. A soft towel is best for drying the hair. When it is half-dry massage your hair with the shampoo. Then apply a solidified brilliantine. Apply this lightly on a brush or with the fingertips to add lustre and keep loose ends in place.

Experiment with your hair style occasionally. While it may be true that you look well in the one you have been wearing, very often a new hairdo will help give you a new lease on life.

RATIONED FOODS MAY BE USED AT GROUP FUNCTIONS

The vexed question of the serving of rationed foods at church teas and suppers, and of the sale of homemade cakes, jams and jellies, has been settled by a new order of the War Time Prices and Trade Board, consolidating all previous orders relating to the usage of rationed foods. The section dealing with "shared meals" makes it lawful for one or more members of a group to bring foods bought against their ration books for general consumption at group functions.

As regards the sales of homemade foodstuffs, it is ruled that sugar and butter lose their identity when incorporated into a cake, so there is no legal restriction on the sale of the finished product.

The consumer branch still adheres to its original opinion that where it institutes a fourth meal, the consumption of rationed foods at social gatherings should be drastically curtailed in the interest of the whole country.

THE COOK'S CORNER

CHOCOLATE FLUFF PUDDING

2 ounces unsweetened chocolate
1 3/4 cups milk
1 cup cubes of white bread
1 tablespoon butter (optional)
3 eggs, separated
1-4 teaspoon salt
1-2 cup fine granulated sugar
1 teaspoon pure vanilla
Chopped almonds (optional)

Put the chocolate and place upper pan of double boiler. Add the milk and heat until chocolate melts; beat smooth with rotary beater on heat to scalding point. Add the 2 1/2 cups and the butter, if used.

Beat egg-whites with salt until stiff but not dry.

Beat the egg-yolks slightly and gradually beat in the sugar. Add milk mixture, then fold in the egg-whites and the vanilla.

Turn into greased baking dish and sprinkle with chopped almonds if desired. Place in a pan of hot water and bake in rather slow oven, 325 degrees, until set so that a knife inserted in the centre comes out clean (about 50 minutes).

Serve hot or cold, with pouring cream. A foamy sauce would be equally delicious on this dessert.

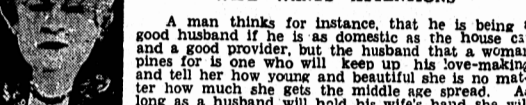

PRE-NUPTIAL PACT BY COUPLE WOULD FRUSTRATE TROUBLE

Boy And Girl Should Agree On How They Will Treat Each Other In Matrimony

The reason there are so many disappointed and disgruntled married couples in the world is because being a good husband or a good wife is such a loosely defined job. Everyone knows what the qualifications of a good lawyer or doctor or secretary must be and what his or her duties and responsibilities are, but no one knows just what makes a man or woman a good husband or wife.

And what complicates the situation is that a man's idea of being a good husband is entirely different from a woman's idea of what constitutes a good wife, just as a woman's idea of being a perfect wife is not at all a man's conception of one.

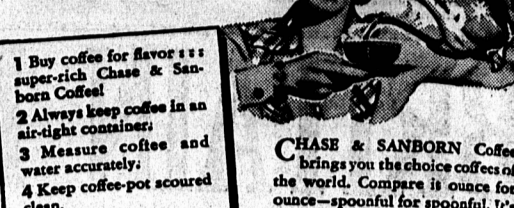
