**Farmers Not Shipping Cattle**

TORONTO, Sept. 3—(CP)—Meat retailers here said today farmers are not shipping cattle, fearing there is not an active-bidding market due to the seven-day-old strike of close to 4,000 workers in six Swift Canadian company plants. Representatives of the United Packinghouse Workers of America and of the Swift Company, met again today in efforts to settle the strike in plants in Moncton, N.B., Toronto, St. Boniface, Man., Edmonton, Moose Jaw, Sask., and New Westminster, B. C. One large market butcher concern here said supplies are 20 to 25 per cent down and many of the choice cuts unobtainable. Stock yards quotations today showed good beef killers 25 to 50 cents up in price. John Langlet, spokesman for the union which seeks a new contract which will guarantee a basic hourly wage of 92 cents, said it is indicated the strike will extend into next week. The union—whose wage boost demands call for a 15 cents an hour increase in Toronto and 20 cents at other plants—also is negotiating new contracts with Canada Packers and Burns and Co. An official of the Ontario Labor Department said the department had received no request for intervention. If either the union or the company made such a request, the government likely would appoint a conciliator to deal with the dispute as it affects the Toronto plant only.
