#### MURRAY HARBOR NORTH SOLDIERS WELCOMED HOME.

A very interesting and most enjoyable meeting was held in the hall at Cambridge, Lot 62, on Saturday night, April 12, when the people of the Murray Harbor North Presbyterian congregation gathered at this central place to heartily welcome home a number of those whose names are on its honor roll, and who have recently returned from various phases of military service. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Mr. Sutherland, with whom were seated upon the platform the following returned soldiers: Lieut. Leslie MacDonald, Lieut. Wendell Graham, Gunner John MacLean, Ptes. George Kennedy, Ellis Jenkins, Harry Johnston, David Irving, William Davidson, and Seaman Samuel Leeco. Ptes. Webster Clow, Earle Hooper and Ivan MacKeenon were unable to be present, but were referred to during the evening as having also returned from military service in different places.

A carefully prepared and well rendered program of twelve numbers was divided into two sections, between which the pastor spoke briefly referring in eulogistic terms to the part taken by the men to the congregation in the great war, and to the pleasure it afforded his people to be present upon this occasion. He then read an address which had been prepared by the congregational war work committee, a copy of which was placed in the hands of each soldier by Mr. Harry Butler, while a suitable gift was presented by Mr. Russell Finley on behalf of the congregation to each man. Replying on behalf of the returned men, Lieuts. MacDonald and Graham and Gunner MacLean thanked the congregation for the reception as well as for former evidences of interest in the men, making special reference to the work of the local Red Cross organizations during the war.

On behalf of the local I. O. G. T. lodge, Mrs. Gaven Hicken and Mr. R. Finley made a special presentation to Messrs. MacDonald, Johnston and Davidson, members of that organization. At the conclusion of the program those present were invited upstairs where the Ladies' Aid societies had a beautiful supper prepared, the soldiers and their immediate friends were first seated followed by others. After supper the young people enjoyed a few games, and a display of fireworks outside, all dispersing to their homes at an hour suitable to the fact that it was Saturday evening.

From this congregation about forty men have been in uniform, of whom over half are still abroad, while six have made the supreme sacrifice. To the memory of these a suitable monument is to be erected at an early date.
