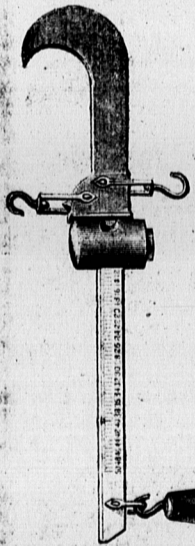

HORSE NOTES

It has often been said that horses from this province are too cold blooded to be able to stand up and fight a race or go through a campaign.

It is claimed that if a trotter starts early in the racing season he is sure to be out of business before the season has been nearly finished. Now, while this may be true in some instances, it is not altogether the fault of the horse, because a number of provincial horsemen think that the animals should be able to reel off a few fast quarters. This has been known to happen to horses that went to Halifax from here last October, they were not properly worked before leaving home; then, because they cannot beat other horses that are worked regularly they are called cold-blooded.

An instance to the contrary is the Island bred Brazilian gelding Prince Louis. This horse was never broken to light harness till he was in his fourth year, and in the fall of that year he went to Halifax and won second money in the four year old class. In the following year he was driven to light harness out was never raced. He was then in his five year old form. As a six year old he was raced a little through Maine and took a mark of 2:23. He was worked a little all that winter, and in the season of 1909 he was entered in the stake and other classes that he was eligible for. The first race was at Fredericton—2:24 trot—eight starters—and here he won second money. Next was Woodstock—2:24 trot—seven starters—here he obtained first money. Then St. John—2:24 trot—seven starters—first money won. Sussex—2:24 trot—four starters—won first money. Bar Harbor, Maine—2:20 trot and pace—third money. This latter was the hardest race of the season, as he had to race against three pacers and threedrivers. The time by heats was 2:23; 2:20; 2:19; 2:21; 2:22 and 2:22. Machias was the next place visited and here in the 2:20 trot and pace he won first money, and next day at the same place he won second position in the free-for-all trot and pace. In the next race, a 2:21 trot, Prince Louis only landed fourth money, but was the winner to a mark of 2:18. Halifax was the last place visited and here he won second in the 2:22 trot and pace, and second in the 2:20 trot. In this latter race he could have won, out on account of not having to go out of the 2:20 class all season his owner thought better to take second money.

His total winnings for the year was made up by five firsts; four seconds, one third and one fourth.

This does not look like a very cold-blooded horse, and he was raised on Prince Edward Island too. It is learned from a party who saw him work out that he trotted a mile in 2:16; and it looks as if he will make a pretty good 2:20 horse for 1910, and a trotter at that.

Hurray for the cold-blooded Prince Edward Island horses!

BAD FIRE AT OXFORD.

AMHERST, November 26—A message from Oxford early this morning, asked that the firemen proceed at once with an engine and other apparatus, as the town of Oxford threatened fire.

The telephone wires were out of order and unable to get connections. The fire started in McIntosh's Drug Store, and has completely destroyed that and several other buildings along the Main street, including Ross's tailor establishment. The Oxford Clothing Company's store, Peter Slade's large establishment, the old post office and other buildings in the vicinity. When the last message was received the fire was still raging fiercely, and the whole business section of the town is threatened.

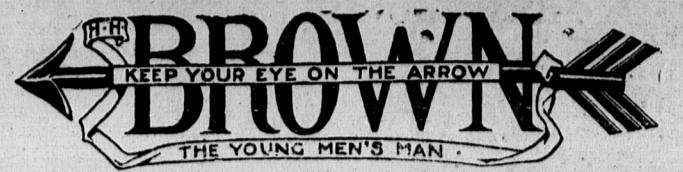

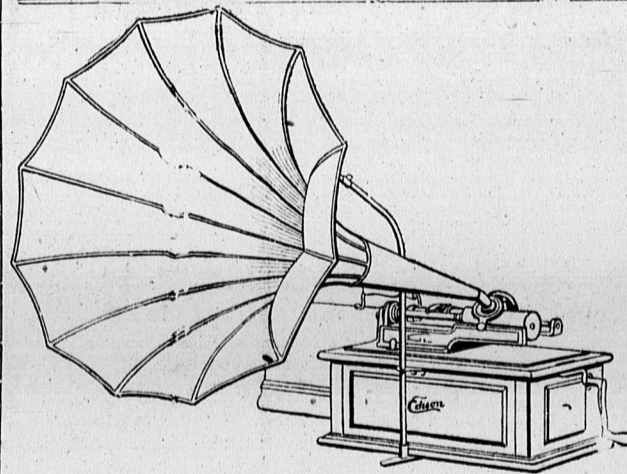
