THE Bureau of Publicity of the Pan American Exposition has just issued a very complete booklet descriptive of the enterprise to be held at Buffalo next year. The booklet contains 48 pages with 11 titles and 82 illustrations. The publicity up to the present time has been piecemeal; bringing out the various features as they have developed, but examination of this booklet gives to the reader a very comprehensive idea of the splendid character of the Exposition. The total cost of the Exposition, exclusive of exhibits, is now estimated at \$10,000,000. Of this amount about \$3,000,000 will be expended upon the Midway. The sum for the Midway is more than the total cost of some very pretentious expositions, so that by comparison one may gain a very fair idea of the work which Buffalo is carrying rapidly to completion. A beautiful landscape comprising 320 acres, half a mile wide and a mile and a quarter long, is devoted to this wonderful enterprise.
