VISITING CHILDREN MUST WORK AT FITTING INTO HOUSEHOLD

Summer time is visiting time for many children. They will be the guests of friends and relatives. Thus, it is important that they know how to be the perfect guests, to know what such a guest does and how he does it; so that when he leaves at the end of his visit, he leaves the door open behind him and a welcome awaiting his return. The perfect guest arrives on the day, and he leaves—in spite of any invitation to the contrary—on the time and hour he arranged to go. On his arrival he is shown his room, and he puts his belongings in their places and keeps them there for the duration of his stay. Never does he scatter them about the house, nor about his room. He watches the routine of the household and fits into it. He makes no suggestions for his own entertainment, but waits for the plans set for him by his hosts. Then he falls in with them cheerfully and as though they were the only things needed for his complete enjoyment. He always must indicate he is enjoying his stay, by enjoying whatever is offered him as food, recreation and entertainment. He sees where he can be helpful without being intrusive. Maybe there is a younger child who needs to be entertained while his mother is occupied. Maybe there are little chores about the house that can be done—in changing the flowers, putting in fresh ones and removing the leftover material. There is always some little duty that a guest can take over and so lighten the tasks for someone else. Once taken over it must be faithfully performed. The guest does not use anything belonging to the family without first asking permission, and he does not ask unless he is very sure that it can be granted without any sacrifice or inconvenience on their part. The visitor is especially careful to consider the older people in the household—when they enter a room, seeing they have a comfortable chair if they do not at once go to an accustomed one, and in all ways considering their habits and comfort, remembering to wait to be addressed before talking to them. This means attention to the task.
