Winnipeg Grain
WINNIPEG, April 4—(CP)—Oats and barley prices rallied from early losses Saturday on the Win-nipeg Grain Exchange, and closed slightly above Friday prices. The upturn in prices was due mainly to commission house and local buying.
Rye rallied, following a 10-cent maximum decline in May rye due to hedging sales. Export buying, that came in at the low levels, started the rally.
The prices of class two wheat for export to countries other than the United Kingdom were in creased one cent.

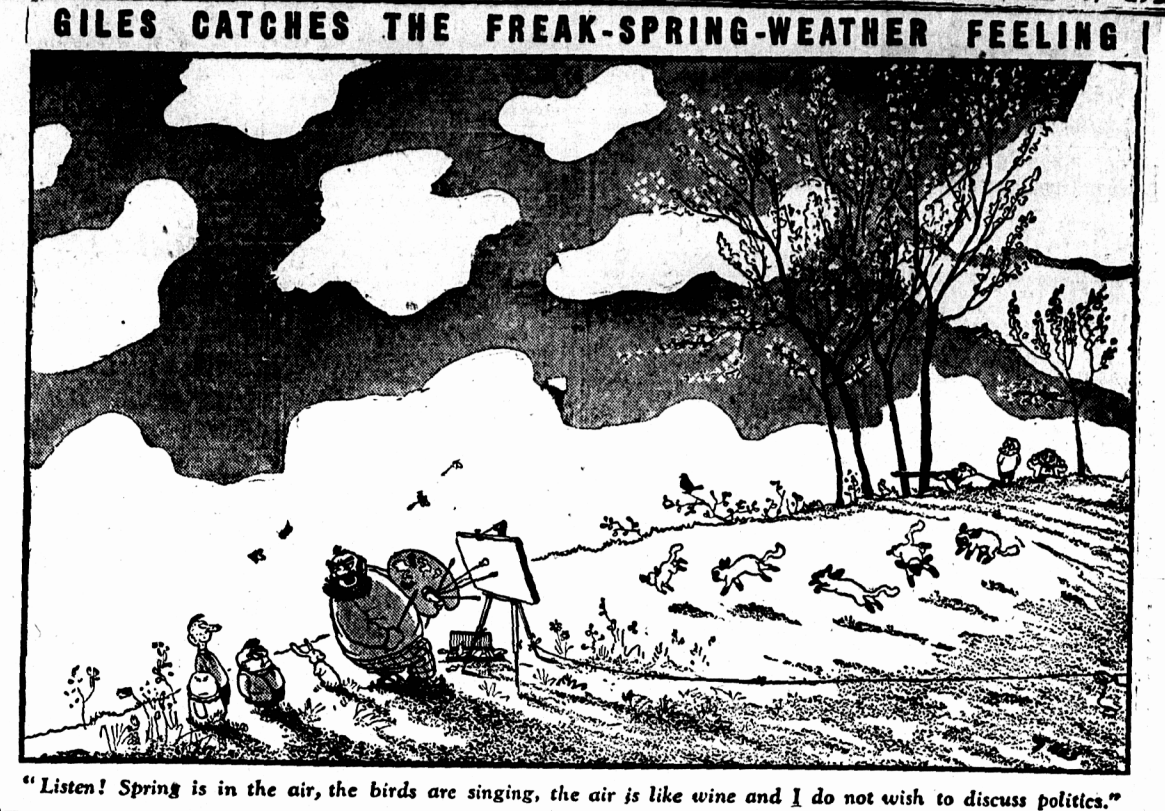
