Charge Mother Of Three With Murder

PORT LAMBTON, Ont., May 10 (CP) — Mrs. Jean Mary Ange, 37-year-old mother of three small children, was under police guard in hospital in nearby Sarnia tonight after being charged with the revolver shooting of her husband in their home here.

She suffered a nervous breakdown last night after allegedly firing three .22 calibre shots into the body of 36-year-old Thomas L. Ange, proprietor of the Ohio Hotel here. The shooting occurred, police said, after a quarrel earlier in the Ange home.

Mrs. Ange heard the formal murder charge from her hospital bed today and was remanded until May 18.

Jack Reddick, a family friend and resident at Ange's Ohio Hotel, told police he found the man lying in the living room. Thirteen-year-old Tommy Ange, was holding his father's shoulders and screaming: "Daddy's shot." Two other children, Beverly Ann, 10, and Jimmy, six, were asleep in another room. A .22 calibre revolver was found under a bed.

Reddick told police he rushed to the Ange home when he heard someone shout: "I've done it. I've shot him." He met Mrs. Ange running from the house, clad in pyjamas.

Police said Ange was shot three times, twice in the back and once in the chest.

Big Run On Candy In Britain

LONDON, May 10—The House of Commons agreed today that adults are trying to prove that taking candy from a baby really is easy.

The majority opinion seemed to be that Britain's candy cupboard is bare because grown-ups simply won't let the sweet stuff alone.

Food Minister John Strachey faced a critical chorus on the matter during the question period.

Mrs. Joan Mann, Labor member for Coatbridge, wanted to know whether the Minister would consider drastic action against "people who are running in and out of confectionary shops buying as much as 20s-worth (\$4) at a time."

George Chetwynd, Labor member for Stockton-on-Tees, said some people were acting as though they had never seen chocolate before. Children, who never had been able to buy unrationed candy, were not getting their fair share.

Amid ironic laughter from the Opposition benches, Strachey said it was always possible that some adults may behave like children.

He told Archer Baldwin, Conservative for Leominster, that a government advertisement costing £3,200 (\$12,000) asked adults to go easy on candy. Baldwin said it was wasting taxpayers' money to encourage children to be selfish about sweets.

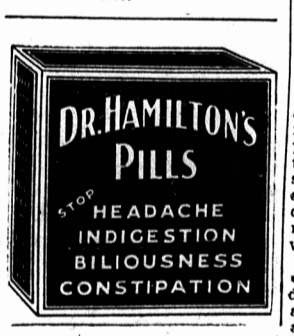
What they needed was not candy but proteins.

The Commons debated the question against the background of the growing shortage of sweets. Since rationing ended April 24—seven years after its introduction in July, 1942—stocks have been going down quickly.

Southern Korea President Calls For U. S. Help

President Syngman Rhee of the southern half of Korea is yelling for help from the United States to fight the Communists.

They keep crossing the 38th parallel from the Russian-sponsored north to the United States arms to beat them off.

He asks, in a public statement, whether his government can count on "all-out American aid" in case of attack.

The question is extremely important in view of a peculiar thing about the Korea: the cold war has gone farther there in one sense than anywhere else—even in Germany. That is, the United States and other Western Powers recognize Rhee's government as the legal government for all Korea. Russia and her satellites recognize the Communist regime in the north as the legal government for all Korea.

Any diplomatic solution of this impasse would involve withdrawal of such recognition by one side or another—in other words there is no apparent way to back out gracefully for anyone who might be interested.

A month ago Dr. Rhee's ambassador in Washington, Chough Pyung-Ok, asked for a United States military aid program similar to the one which has been going to the Greek Government for the last two years.

Rhee wants to double his present American-equipped Southern Korean army of 50,000 men. With the 50,000 police he has, his total force would just about equal the Communist forces in Northern Korea, according to one version.

There is another version, which is that Rhee's army already has the northerners out-gunned. There are 22,000,000 Southern Koreans and about 9,000,000 northerners. Some reports say that if anybody is likely to attack in Korea it is more likely to be Rhee's southerners attacking the north rather than the other way round.

This hasn't happened either way—yet—and is still a matter of opinion. There is no question that Korea's tangled affairs are moving to a climax.

This draws nearer a date for the withdrawal of United States troops is discussed. Only a token force of a regimental combat team remains.

Russia withdrew her troops from the north some time ago and turned it over to local Communists who were ready and willing to keep Northern Korea safely in the Soviet orbit.

The common fear in the Orient is that when the last United States troops leave Southern Korea, the southerners and northerners will plunge into civil war. Dr. Rhee obviously wants enough military strength to repel any attack from the north, but not everyone is convinced that he would refrain from trying to reunite Korea by force if provided with the arms he asks to defend himself.

British Dentists Angry With Gov't.

LONDON, May 10 — (CP) — Britain's nationalized dentists are squirming under the painful economic thrusts of Health Minister Aneurin Bevan.

The men are angry because Bevan wants to cut their fees.

They say the Health Minister's proposals mean the net fee for an extraction would be reduced from 10s to 8s. For this and other reasons, British dentists' organizations have refused an invitation to discuss the matter with Bevan.

The Health Minister, who has asked the dentists to meet him next Monday, is expected to stand pat on his pronouncement that the cuts must be made. They are slated to become effective May 31 and will range from 12 1/2 to 20 per cent for the 10,000 dentists enrolled in the National Health Service.

In letters dispatched to Bevan during the week-end, the three dentists' organizations said they are not prepared to "engage in any interim discussions" which
