Was born in the County of Prince Edward, Ontario, on the 23rd. May 1860, and was educated at the local schools, Upper Canada College, Toronto, and Albert University, Belleville. He entered Osgoode Hall as Student-at-Law, and was called to the Bar of Upper Canada in 1885. He has always enjoyed the confidence of his fellow-citizens, and after serving several years in the Council was elected Mayor of Belleville in 1891. In January 1902 as a by-election he was elected to the House of Commons for West Hastings by over five hundred majority.
