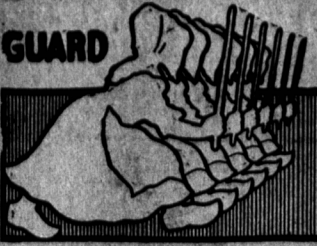

GERMANY SOUGHT APPEAL TO ARMS

Reason Given For the Increase to French Peace Footing.

PARIS, March 17 (Special)—The Paris newspaper L'Intransigeant, in an article explaining the increased military activity in France, recently says that through an indiscretion of an eminent Italian politician the French government learned on January 13 that Germany had asked Italy if she could be ready to join with Germany and Austria in a campaign to begin in October, 1913, to put an end by decisive action to the general uneasiness in Europe. The French government made inquiries, which resulted in full confirmation of this information, and then decided to proceed with urgent military measures.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of reliable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which he desires to homestead. Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$2.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to clear, homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.

BOLD ROBBERS FOUND BY CANDLE LIGHT

MONTREAL, March 13.—Vandals late last night made a desperate attempt to rob St. Edward's Roman Catholic Church, located at the corner of Beaubien and St. Denis streets, on the north side. Shortly after ten o'clock when the night watchman was making a final round, after church had been dismissed, he heard a faint noise coming from a room in the basement, where many of the religious vestments and articles are stored. In the dim light cast by a candle he made out the forms of two men, in the act of packing away the rich gold and silver vessels and the costly vestments.

With the slightest amount of noise, he returned to the street through a side door, and met Constable Charland, of number 15 station, who was passing the edifice at the time. The return of the watchman, reinforced by the officer, startled the two thieves, who immediately blew out the candle, leaving the room in darkness. Before the watchman could reach the electric switch that would flood the basement with light, a crash of falling glass notified the startled pair of the manner in which the two men had made good their escape.

A hurried search of the neighborhood was made, but no trace of the pair could be found, their footsteps being lost in the slush that overflowed the streets. The case has been reported to the detectives, who are busy scouring the neighborhood for the pair.

ROUGH TIME FOR SUFFRAGETTES

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, March 16.—Suffragettes who attempted to hold a Sunday afternoon meeting in Hyde Park were mobbed by ten thousand persons, who pelted them with turf, oranges and other missiles. When the police escorted them from the scene rosters tore off their hats and cloaks and struck them in the face. Mrs. Laura Drummond mounted a wagon and started to speak to the assemblage when a clod of turf struck her in the face. In the vast crowd the police tried to draw about the women and escort them out of the park to the station, but the crowd brushed them aside and dragged the women up and down the streets. One woman had an eye blackened, and all her clothes torn. After half an hour of struggling the police succeeded in getting the badly mauled women into the subway. Details of an elaborate suffrage plot to kidnap Lloyd George has been found out, and a large force of detectives are guarding him as a consequence.
