**THE STEAMERS.**—The Minto docked in Georgetown yesterday morning at 10.50 with 28 tons freight, 40 passengers and 80 sacks mail. The Earl Grey docked in Picton from Charlottetown at 11.35 taking over 189 tons freight, 42 passengers and 75 sacks mail.

**WEDDING BELLS.**—The wedding of Charles E. Simmons, son of Mr. Chas. Simmons, Foreman Painter, F. E. L. Highway to Miss Mary Ida Frazer of Chatham, N. B. took place in St. John, N.B., Feb. 18th, the Rev. G. F. Scoville rector of St. Jude's Church officiated. They will live in Halifax.

The Honorable Charles Dalton has given another instance of his public spirited benevolence in the shape of a \$50,000 gift to St. Dunstan's College payable in annual instalments of \$5,000 for ten years.

This announcement was made to The Guardian yesterday afternoon by His Lordship the Bishop of Charlottetown and at a late hour last night a representative of the Guardian interviewed the generous donor who confirmed the announcement, modestly requesting that little should be said on the subject.

The gift is entirely unsolicited and, like all of Mr. Dalton's benefactions, spontaneous; moreover it is without conditions and will be utilized for the benefit of the College in such manner as the Bishop and governors may deem best.

St. Dunstan's College was opened for the reception of students in January 1855, the first rector being the Rev. Anselm McDonald who directed the destinies of the new college with distinguished ability and success until 1874. In the arduous work connected with the opening and management of the institution, he was ably assisted by Rev. James Phelan, at that time a young ecclesiastic, now Monsignor Phelan, V. G. of Charlottetown.

In 1892, the College was affiliated to the University of Laval, Quebec. This important step placed it on a new footing, and indeed formed an epoch in the history of the Institution.

The present rector is Rev. Terence Campbell under whose able guidance the college is taking a foremost place not only in the province but throughout Canada.

The value of this munificent gift is enhanced by the fact that it has been presented in the form of \$10,000 in shares in the Charles Dalton Silver Black Fox Co. Limited, the donor guaranteeing that should the dividends at any time during the next ten years, fall below 50 per cent, (\$5,000) he himself will make

good the difference. At the end of ten years the shares become the unrestricted property of the College.

**FRIDAY**
