MARITIME BOARD OF TRADE.
In view of the approaching annual meeting of the Maritime Board of Trade, which takes place at New-castle, N. B., on August 20, the New-castle Board of Trade held a meeting a few nights ago and made the following arrangements.—Subjects for discussion: That the attention of the Canadian Railway Commission be drawn to the unfair discrimination of the Transcontinental and other railways in the matter of passenger rates in favor of Western Canada as against Eastern Canada. That the attention of the Provincial Government be called to the advisability of abolishing the present system of leasing our streams to clubs and individuals to control for fishing purposes, but to adopt a system of issuing licenses for fishing on streams the same as they do for hunting big game. That the attention of the Government be called to the advisability of revising the present system of municipal taxation. That the Maritime Board of Trade urge upon the different provincial boards of education the advisability of introducing more agricultural and technical instruction into the common and high schools, to the exclusion of classical and higher mathematical subjects. That the Maritime Board co-operate with all other authorities in promoting construction of proposed inter-provincial highway across Canada. The executive council of the board was appointed a committee to make arrangements for entertaining of visiting delegates, with power to add to their number.

COURT OF APPEAL AND EQUITY.
—When the Court of Appeal and Equity re-opened yesterday morning the appeal case of Mathieson and another, against Elizabeth Duffy and others came on for hearing. For the appellants, Mr. Bentley, K. C., appeared; for the respondents, Mr. Johnston, K. C. The presiding judge was His Lordship Chief Justice Sully and Mr. Justice Hazard, Master of the Rolls. Mr. Bentley stated that the stenographer's notes of evidence in the case were not available, and in order to afford an opportunity for these to be obtained, the hearing of the appeal was adjourned to the Court to 10th September next.

ROLLED OATS MILL PROJECT.
—With regard to the proposal by the Colonial Corporation, Limited, of Halifax, to establish a rolled oats mill in Charlottetown, towards which object they desire certain concessions from the City Council, the firm has been written to by the Recorder, on behalf of the Council, requesting them to lay before the Council further information as to the financial position of the company and the number of persons to be employed in their mill, and other particulars, before the Council take any further steps in the matter. It will be recalled that besides asking the Council to give them free a site for the proposed mill, free water for ten years and exemption from taxation for the same period, the company also desired to be afforded right of way for their mill erected, but this, they have been informed, the City Council have no power to grant them.

KELLY'S CROSS.—Mr. J. E. McQuaid in anticipation of profiting by the fox business had traps set and was lucky enough last week to find in one of them what some pronounce a silver black fox. His friends hope for Mr. McQuaid's benefit it is of that species.—His friends are very sorry that their good neighbor Mr. Thomas Kelly, owing to ill health, has to relinquish farming, and before long he shall, with more of the good men and true, be no longer in their midst.—Kelly's Cross bridge, which was completely swept away last spring, is none too staunch in its temporary condition. The residents trust the representatives, Messrs. Kennedy and Myers, will at once make a permanent job of it.

COMMENDABLE.—In travelling through the country one is apt to notice any improvements that may be made on or along the roads. One thing that took the attention of the traveller as he passed through the Pownal District was the neat and substantial railing placed on either side of the most dangerous culverts, and is creditable alike to the Road-master and the parties who did the work. This is unique as regards culverts, being the first that the writer has noticed, and is a step in the right direction, and should be made compulsory, as those culverts, unmarked, are most dangerous places on dark nights, which many have found to their loss and often serious injury.
