ST. JAMES CHURCH At the Kirk yesterday morning a large congregation greeted the special preacher, Wing Commander, Rev. J. Ross Brown, M.A., Chief Church of Scotland Chaplain for the R. A. F. in Canada, who brought greetings from the Mother Church to the parish of St. James and delivered a forceful and thought-provoking sermon. In the evening the minister, Rev. T. H. Bussell Somers, M.A., S.T.M., preached on the words "Make me as one of thy hired servants." (St. Luke 5:19). Miss Lillian Mackenzie, M.B.E., had in charge of all the music for the day.

THE BAPTIST CHURCH At the morning service the Rev. J. L. Levy's sermon was "A Mountain Top Experience." In the gospel of Saint Mark chapter 9 we have one of the great stories of the New Testament, the Transfiguration, an experience marking a definite stage in the Master's mission. In the early chapters of Saint Mark we see Jesus in a period of great popularity, then follows a time of rising opposition, of bitterness increasing as time passed, with an open break in chapter 7. Jesus and his disciples retire toward Tyre and Sidon to escape from the crowds, to think, to pray to commune with the Father, to give training to his disciples that the gospel may be carried on when as he realizes the hates and jealousies of opposition shall effect his death. The transfiguration is a spiritual experience embodying three memorials, that of the Law, the message of the Prophets and the gospel of grace and love. Ours it is to respect law, we escape law not by breaking, but by living above it. The prophets bring the worship of one God, a pure ethical religion, then in the disciples' experience comes the "love" and "they saw no man save Jesus only," with the words of the Father, "this is my beloved son, hear him. The Junior Choir led in the music of the morning, singing Doane's "Tread Softly."

At the usual session of the Church School was held at 2:30 P.M. At the evening service the sermon was delivered by the Rev. Donald Boothroyd, a thoughtfully eloquent sermon on "The Law Walk." The evening anthem was "Teach me the way Thy Salvation," by John Inch, Mus. Bac. organist and choirmaster was in charge of the music of the day.
