Deadlock in Mines Still Unbroken

LONDON, May 30.—There is not the slightest sign of a compromise from any quarter in the coal dispute and the government is making preparations for a long stoppage in the industry. The miners have been on strike since May 1.

It has been decided by the government to ask parliament when it reassembles next month to extend operation of the emergency powers act for another month in addition to the month sanctioned when the general strike was called. This will empower the ministers to take whatever steps are needed to conserve and ration coal and other fuel to the best advantage.

The Liberal and Labor press is indulging in adverse criticism of Premier Baldwin, for what is described as his complete inactivity so far as making any attempt to put an end to the deadlock. The newspapers point out there is danger of a war of attrition between the miners and mine owners.

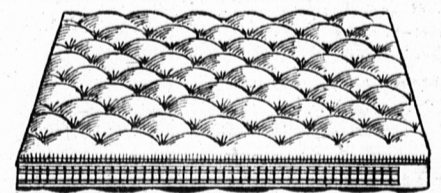

Capt. Roach Will Command Survey Ship

HALIFAX, N. S., May 28.—The Canadian Government Acadia, which has been lying in this port two years, will sail next week on a charting and surveying expedition to the Gulf of St. Lawrence, relieving the Cartier, the only government survey steamer now in operation in Atlantic waters, with headquarters at Quebec. The steamer will be in charge of Captain James Roach, of Charlottetown, P. E. I. and the survey work will be done by Commander Fraser of Ottawa and a staff of hydrographic engineers. The steamer will sail for Gaspe and will work the Belle Isle route, north of Anticosti bringing charts up to date and uncharted obstacles to existing navigation.

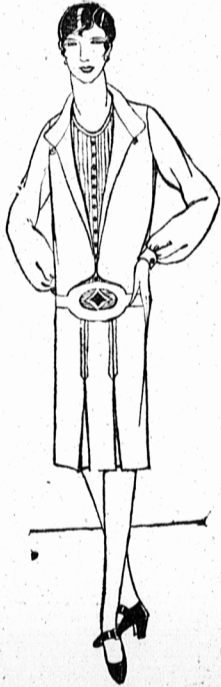
