DAINTY EFFECTS IN A HANDMADE BLOUSE

The round yoke in this design is cleverly trimmed with insertions of needle point that are worked directly upon the sheer linen fabric although applications of almost any lace would fill the bill as well. The blouse is shirred over cords to the yoke, and the lace appliques are worked in slightly wavy lines all around the body.
