Stomachs Dictate Votes in Germany

BERLIN, June 14 —(AP)—Germans still are voting as their stomachs dictate. Recent local elections in the United States zone showed the most appealing party slogans were "where are the potatoes?" and "throw the rascals in power out."

On the whole, Germans are voting more from material outlooks than from political convictions. This is borne out by an American Military Government analysis of public opinion in the United States zone.

Tax Refunds In The Offing

OTTAWA, June 14 —(Special)—Revenue Minister McCann this afternoon announced that before next March 31, there would be 5,903 persons in Prince Edward Island receiving cheques for the refundable portion of their 1943 and 1944 income taxes.

Repayment of the "forced savings" part of the 1942 income tax was paid this spring with 1,213 cheques being mailed in Prince Edward Island.

Of that total 36 tax-payers who had refunds coming to them couldn't be found at the expiration of the due payment date last March 31.

But one by one, said Minister McCann, the unpaid refunds all would have been honored.

The cheques covering 1943 and 1944 refunds will go into the mails as soon as they become ready in alphabetical order.

For P.E.I. there was 2,901 refunds for 1943 taxes and 3,002 on 1944 payments.

For all but those in the high income brackets the two-in-one refund is expected to cover next April's income tax payment.
