—At a special meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade on Friday evening a resolution was unanimously adopted asking: (1) That one of the winter steamers take up the service between Summerside and Tormentine not later than Dec. 1st. (2) That said steamer remain on the route until Jan. 10, and as much later as ice conditions will permit. (3) That previous to the withdrawal of the steamer at least 48 hours notice be given shippers of the intention of such withdrawal. (4) That equitable through freight rates via this route between all points on the Island and Intercolonial railways be arranged and that such rates be furnished all station agents and the agents of the steamer at Summerside and Tormentine before the beginning of the service. (5) That special trains be provided at Summerside and Tormentine to connect with the said steamer on the withdrawal of the summer steamers. (6) That the Tormentine pier be placed on the same footing with regard to wharfage charges as Point du Chêne and Pictou, that is that no wharfage be charged on through freight. (7) That adequate facilities be provided at Tormentine for the expeditious handling and housing of freight. (8) That information as to the movements of the winter steamers be bulletined daily at all stations along the Intercolonial and P. E. Island Railways. Also resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Hon. J. D. Hazen, Minister of Marine, Dr. P. C. Murphy, M. G. Sjödal, and each of the representatives of the Province at Ottawa.—Exc.

AMERICAN LEAGUE PLAYERS WHO WON BASEBALL HONORS
CHICAGO, November 15—Fielding honors among pitchers of the American league went to Chief Bender, of the Philadelphia club. According to the official averages of the 1911 season, announced by President Johnson, the Philadelphia pitcher played in 31 games without an error, finishing with a percentage of 1.000. He accumulated sixty-nine chances, having 159 assists and 27 7 put-outs, the largest number of any American league pitcher. Waish finished twelfth in the list with a percentage of .959.

Ruben Oldring, of Philadelphia is leader among the outfielders with a percentage of .975. He played 119 games, had 225 put-outs, 13 assists and only five errors.

Tannehill, of Chicago, led the short-stops with a percentage of .941. He made only 29 errors in accepting 642 chances. Stovel, of Cleveland, is the real leader among the first basemen. Although Zider, of Chicago, tops the list. Stovel's percentage is .986. In 118 games he made 1,073 put-outs, 87 assists and 17 errors.

McConnell, of Chicago, leads the list of second basemen, but Collins, of Philadelphia, probably is the real leader, as he handled 637 chances and made only 24 errors. Sullivan of Chicago heads the list of catchers with a percentage of .986. Thomas, of Philadelphia, although sixth in the list, probably is Sullivan's nearest rival.

Although Turner, of Cleveland, leads the third basemen, Baker of Philadelphia finished with a better record. Turner took part in 148 games, whereas Turner played only 92.
