The cold snap of last Tuesday and Wednesday will be remembered for some time by the civic authorities, especially in the Commissioners of Water and Water Supply office. On Wednesday and Thursday following the heavy frost, that department was kept busy, their men were sent from one section of the city to the other, turning off water for householders whose pipes had burst. But this is not all, nor is it the most important fact in this connection. Despite the requests of the Commissioners at the last regular meeting of the City Council when they, in their annual report, asked that citizens be notified to give up the wasteful habit of turning on the water in their taps in cold weather to prevent freezing, citizens have continued to allow the water supply to be depleted in this way. They even went one better on the Commissioners and figures given by the officials show that there were fully 350,000 gallons wasted in the side of twenty-four hours. The proper remedy for the prevention of water pipes being affected by frost is to turn the water off in the cellar when all danger is removed and no waste results. The officials claim that the class who are the greatest offenders in this respect are those who have sewerage and sinks in their houses, and not the poorer classes who have no way of disposing of the steady flow of water if they would adopt this course. As pointed out in the report of the Commissioners there is but one way to bring citizens to the economic use of water and that is by the installation of meters in every house in the city. Until this is done the City's water supply will still suffer loss through the flagrant thoughtlessness of large numbers of its patrons.
