Switchman Killed at Richmond, St. John Priest and a Manufacturer Dead and Quebec Murderer Executed.

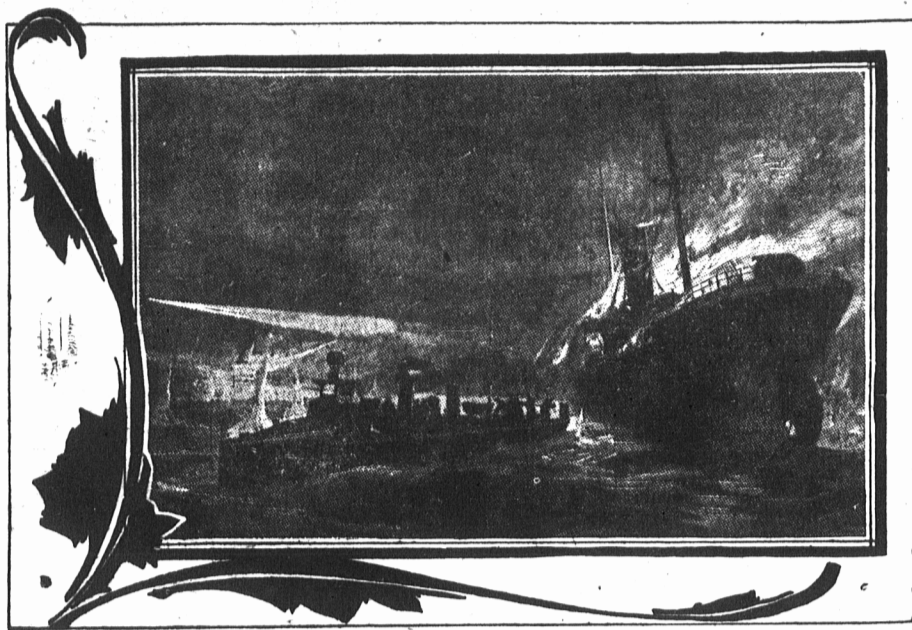

RUSSIAN TORPEDO SINKS TRANSPORT

Vladivostock Squadron Doing Something at Last—Transport Loaded with Rice and Military Stores—Russia to buy Four Argentine Warships.

JAPANESE TRANSPORT SUNK.

St. PETERSBURG, April 28—(Special)—Russian torpedo boats belonging to the Vladivostock squadron sank the Japanese military transport Kinsaku Maru in the night of April 26th with all on board except seventeen officers, twenty soldiers, sixty-five crew and eighty-five coolie carriers.

REFUSED TO SURRENDER.
