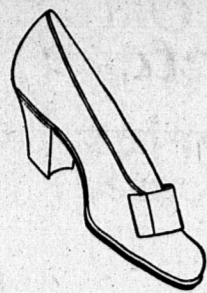

FRUIT SALAD.

Two slices of pineapple will be sufficient, leaving the remainder for a dinner, dessert or next morning's breakfast. Take a pint of fine ripe strawberries, two oranges and three bananas. Cut the pineapple, oranges and bananas into cubes and the strawberries, if large, into halves. Place in a shallow glass dish on a bed of crisp lettuce, and pour a dressing made as follows: Beat the yolks of four eggs until lemon colored. Add a cup of powdered sugar gradually, and half a teaspoonful of salt. When the sugar is thoroughly dissolved beat in the juice of two lemons. If the dressing has an egg taste cook it a few seconds over boiling water and then let it get cold.

Sc. This was followed by two years at the University of Wisconsin, where he lectured on geology and pursued his studies father, receiving the degree of Ph. D. in 1911. During his summer vacations he had been engaged with the geological survey department of Canada and when he left Wisconsin in 1911 he became a permanent member of the department.
