A number of our merchants have offered to personally furnish an equivalent to the bonus demanded of the Government by the company, and Mr. Wiley is most favorably impressed with the project. S. H. Jones the well known sheep buyer represented to Mr. Wiley, very strongly the advantages of Summerside over any other place in the Province as experienced by him in his business. The people of this town feel the need of such an industry, and while Charlottetown is making things somewhat uncomfortable for the Company, Summerside is beginning to stretch out her arms to receive them. The result of the matter coming to a head would mean the moving of the principal part of the plant in Charlottetown to a new building in Summerside and the Charlottetown building being used as a cold storage warehouse. In view of Summerside being so near the mainland and the fact that we have the shortest winter route angrans well in favor of the Western Capital as a location for an industry of this kind. It is understood that the conference held with Mr. Wiley has given our leading men strong hopes for favorable results.
