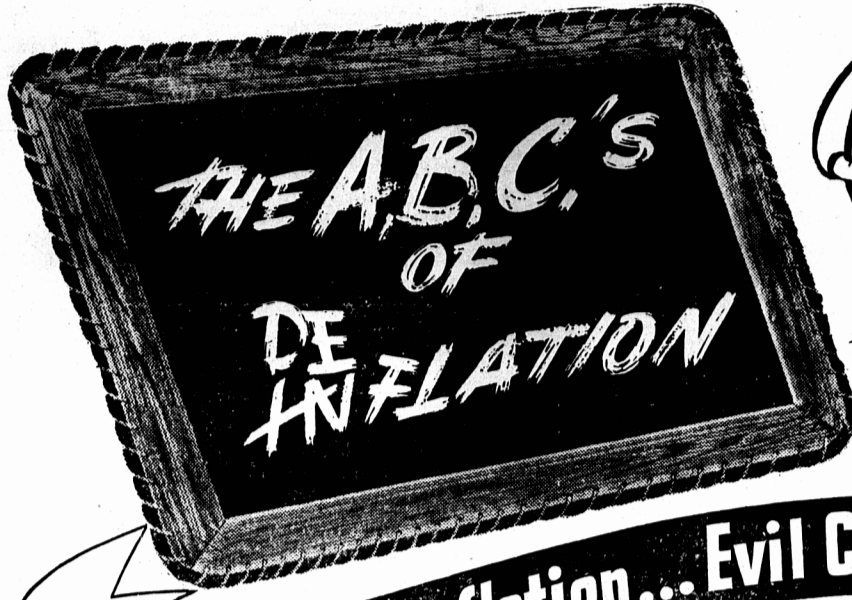

That is why in this war prices are controlled - so that they will not ruin buyers in a rise or sellers in a slump. 14.
