A Broad-Gauge Sabbath Observance

Men and brethren, you pray for many things. Pray also for this, that God will give our people, our Canadian people, back their own souls, that he will quicken those souls with a hunger that can be satisfied only by "Worship" that his Holy Name and His Word and His Day shall be duly honoured. For, believe me, those Sundays are not the happiest or most restful, the most rich in blessing or more profitable, in which people seek their Sabbath rest in the world rather than in Christ, in which they feed the animal and social to the neglect of the spiritual. Those Sundays rather have the happiest eventide in which letters of business and the magazine do not crowd out the sacred Scriptures, in which the ordinary occupations give way to the Father's business, in which no hammer of earthly things is allowed to be heard in the Soul's temple because of the music of the Kingdom of Heaven.
And not unlike the Sabbath eventide will be the eventide of life. It will be rich in its tribute to the King, hallow and rich in blessing. If our Sabbath Days are spent in "Worship," even as Christ spent His in Synagogue and service. There is nothing like right use of the Sabbath to enrich the soul to stand in the presence of God. This was the idea of the saintly George Herbert when he wrote:
The Sundays of man's life,
Threaded together on Time's string,
Make bracelets to adorn the wife
Of the eternal glorious King.

However else therefore we spend the Sunday—and perhaps this time of year we need the warning most—whether free from work or refreshed with the world's refreshment, that Sabbath is lost, is condemned, in which we do not cultivate Worship, the spiritual exercise of the soul, in which we do not refresh our hearts with the living water Christ alone can give, in which we do not recover our connection with the spiritual things and God amid the rush of the our connection with the spiritual world's business. Then and then only shall we realize the second clause of the text how the Son of Man, and therefore man also, is Lord of the Sabbath.

III. CONCLUSION.
So therefore let us do our share in preserving this heritage of our Saxon fathers, this gift of the risen Christ. Let no spirit of Mammon rob us of the day, nor idleness of Spirit rob us of its blessing. No nation has a greater asset than Sabbath, no man a greater blessing. Nay more, the very spirit of calm and repose which floats over the quiet Sabbath morning, the presence of the Holy Spirit of God which seems—at times to answer to the cravings of man's spirit on the quiet Sabbath morning, seems to be God's recognition of man's observance of His Day. Poets, the inspired priests of spiritual things, have noticed this, and of great busy London Wordsworth writes on the Sabbath morn:
Earth has not anything to show more fair:
Dull would he be of soul who could pass by
A sight so touching in its majesty:
This city now doth like a garment wear
The beauty of the morning.

May it ever be so: may our world be ever blessed with such a day to be a restraint to the fevered haste, the foolish appetites, the grosser sins of man, to be a rest to the weariness of man in the strife, to be a oasis in the desert of life ministering the living water that leads to our eternal Sabbath Rest with God.

THE RISEN CHRIST BY THE SEA OF GALILEE.
GOLDEN TEXT.
"Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Matt. 28:20.
Time.—May, A. D. 30.
Place.—The shores of Galilee.

EXPOSITION
I. Lovest thou Me? 15-17. The twenty-first chapter of John is an appendix to the gospel. The gospel naturally ends at 20:31. This appendix is evidently also in John, with the possible exception of verses 24 and 25. The disciples had returned to Galilee because Jesus had hidden them go there (Matt. 26:32; 28:7; Mk. 16:7-10). There were seven of the apostolic company present at this appearance of Christ (v. 2). Thomas was one of the number. Peter was the leader. Peter suggested that they go fishing. Some have thought that this was a temporary desertion of his call on Peter's part. This is pure fancy. Secular occupations are not inconsistent with a true devotion to the work of the prophet, apostle or minister (E. 6:17; Acts 18:3; 20:34). It is well to be honestly busy while awaiting great events. God often grants His special revelations to those who are at the post of secular duty (Luke 2:5; Matt. 4: 18-20, 21). Jesus seemingly approved of this fishing excursion, at all events He took a hand in it (v. 6). Jesus disclosed Himself to the disciples as at their first call of four of them by a miraculous draft of fishes (Luke 5:1-11). When breakfast is over Jesus especially addresses Him to Peter. He was the one who specially needed first to be searched and then encouraged and commissioned. He calls Peter by his weak natural name Simon; for he is about to recall his failure, in which he had not appeared at all as Peter (Man of Rock). The first question brings up Peter's self-confidence boasting and sad fall. "Lovest thou Me more than these?" Peter had boasted that though all the rest were offended he would not be, that he would stand by his Lord even unto death (Matt. 26:33). Peter had thought that his love overtopped the love of all the rest of the disciples. Jesus asks him if he still thinks after his sad de-
