### ISLANDER ENLISTS IN WESTERN CANADA

ST. JOHN.—Coming from the far north-west C. F. Bayfield, M. D. arrived in St. John last evening, completing the first stage of a long journey for the purpose of joining the army medical staff at the front.

Captain Bayfield whose home is at Peace River Crossing, Alberta, 300 miles from Edmonton, and he is an enthusiast on the subject of his adopted home. He went in there two years ago as the pioneer doctor where the country was practically unoccupied, except by the outposts of the Hudson Bay Company. Today the country is filling up rapidly, Peace River Crossing has grown to a population of a thousand and the doctor earnestly asserts that it will not be long before it is as big a city as Edmonton. With a railway, already there, a Hudson Bay headquarters post and a divisional post of the Mounted Police established besides growing commercial life, he considers the town well on its way to becoming a metropolis. The doctor is also a farmer in his spare time and makes great claims for its possibilities as a farming country, the exceptional climate, owing to the depth of the valley which makes it warmer than the districts farther south make it possible to grow things which the Edmonton region cannot produce. Tomatoes for instance, will not ripen around Edmonton, grow red and luscious on his farm and at a recent exhibition in Edmonton his Peace River products in grain and small fruit led the field.

Doctor Bayfield is a Prince Edward Island man who has been in the west for many years and though still a young looking man this is the first return trip to the east in twenty years. Already there are thirty members of his relatives wearing the King's uniform and he decided that it was his turn to do his bit and is now bound overseas as an army medical officer. He is one of quite a large party of medical officers who will be leaving St. John.

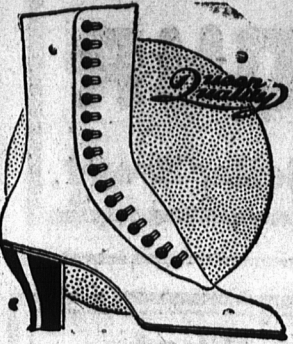

### SIMS PACKING CO. LTD

A representative of The Guardian being shown through the establishment of the Sims Packing Co., Ltd., corner of Kent and Hillsborough Streets. Although only in its first season this is one of the largest plants of the kind in eastern Canada, the commodious four story brick building in which operations are being carried on being admirably adapted to the business and centrally and conveniently located. The plant throughout is supplied with the best and most modern appliances for the handling, curing, packing and shipping of hogs and hog products and since its opening in September has been kept going to the limit of its capacity. Already about a million pounds of pork has been handled and at present the outlook for a continuance of even a larger output is excellent.

At the time of the visit above referred to several hundred carcasses of pork were hanging preparatory to being sent to the different markets involved in the process of cleaning, chilling, cutting up, curing, packing and shipping. An elaborate system of overhead railways with adjustable switches for the necessary change of direction to the different destinations, makes the handling of immense quantities a comparatively easy matter and the hundreds of carcasses which pass through the various processes are disposed of in an incredibly short time. While the above visit was in progress Dr. Pethick, Veterinary Inspector, was engaged in the inspection of a number of dressed carcasses for shipment to the upper province markets. At present Dr. Leigwood, who recently arrived from Toronto is in charge of the inspection work now being conducted in this plant.

The firm has recently received enquiries from Great Britain soliciting consignments of hams and bacon and it is quite probable that in the near future the firm will be exporting large quantities to foreign markets, as during the past few months the demand for Canadian meat from abroad has been very heavy. At present the demand for cured meats, such as hams and bacon, both at home and abroad is excellent, and this firm is particularly well situated to supply a large portion of the demand, their stock in these lines being quite heavy.

The Guardian representative was shown a large quantity of these goods which were being prepared for shipment to points outside the province and as an explanation of the large quantity he was shown a number of letters which expressed in most complimentary terms the opinion of the trade regarding the excellent quality of this firm's goods. In addition to the curing of hams, bacon and barreled pork the firm does an extensive trade in fresh pork sausages, their equipment in this line being very complete. This trade covers a large part of the maritime provinces besides the local market. The hams and bacon put up by the firm will go on the market under the significant brand "Abegweit" which will at once designate the place of origin of these goods and be a testimonial of their good quality.

The firm also manufacture pure leaf lard and are having a large demand for this product both in the local market and in the neighboring provinces. This also will go under the name "Abegweit."

Although in business only a few months the firm has already on its payroll about twenty employees and the number is likely to be greatly increased as the business progresses. For a young concern the firm has already made a most creditable mark for itself in the business world and with its excellent management and enterprise there is no doubt that it will continue to expand until it reaches the limit of island production of raw material. It will prove a great benefit to the agricultural life of the province and will no doubt receive its full share of support from the farmers whom it is calculated to greatly benefit. COPENHAGEN, Dec. 24.—A dispatch to the National Tidende from Christiania says that Henry Ford left Christiania secretly for Bergen, where he expected tonight to go aboard the Norwegian-American line steamer Bergenhus, in order to return to the United States. The dispatch reports that the reason of Mr. Ford's sudden departure was said to be that his doctor had ordered him to rest his tired and over-worked nerves. The remainder of the expedition, ignorant of Mr. Ford's departure, left for Stockholm today, the dispatch says.

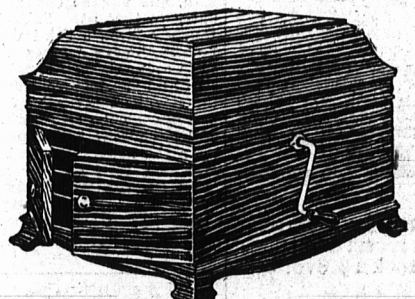
