To St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Charlottetown, \$1,000.00

Also same amount to be paid at \$2,000.00

To the Church Missionary Society, London, England, \$500.00

To the Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, \$1,000.00

To the British and Foreign Bible Society, Canadian Branch, \$500.00

To the Prince Edward Island Hospital, \$3,000.00

To the Y. M. C. A., Charlottetown, \$300.00

The residue of his estate, after payment of succession duties and all other charges is devised and bequeathed to Trustees F. L. Haszard, Horace Haszard, W. H. Aitken and Percy Pope, all of Charlottetown. In Trust to establish and maintain a Refuge and Temporary Home in Charlottetown for the care and training in industrial and Christian ways of friendless young women and girls. The will also provides that there shall be appointed for the management of said home a board of eight trustees, four of whom shall be from St. Paul's Episcopal Church, and one each from the following churches, viz: Zion Presbyterian Church, St. James' Presbyterian Church, the Methodist Brick Church and the Prince Street Baptist Church.

SUCCESSFUL BRITISH OPERATIONS IN EAST AFRICA

LONDON, Aug. 1.—British troops operating in German East Africa have occupied Port Panguni on the East Coast, says an official statement.

"Lieut. Col. Vanderventer took 4,000 head of excellent cattle while advancing on Dodona. Further East, Major General Hoskins has been clearing the country south of Usambira. The Railway Port of Panguni has been taken and Minor columns are pressing the enemy southward between Ngura Hill and the Coast.

"Anglo-Belgians are progressing in the region of Lake Victoria; Nyanza from their bases at Lake Ports."


