COMMENT ON CURRENT EVENTS.

The death of Sir William Pearce Howland of Toronto has removed one of Canada's eldest and most reputable public men. He was born in New York State in May, 1811, and at his demise was in his 96th year. In his earlier and middle life he was engaged in trade and banking. He was elected to the Canadian Assembly in 1837, and held the seat for ten years till the union, being afterwards elected to the House of Commons. He held at various times the positions of Minister of Finance, Receiver General, Postmaster General, and Minister of Finance a second time in the Province of Canada. In the first Government of the Dominion he held the portfolio of Irish Revenue for one year and was then appointed Lieutenant Governor of Ontario which office he held for five years. He was knighted in 1879. Sir William was a man of upright life and of kindly impulses. He was at various times president of banks, loan and insurance companies, and of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

The proposal that the steam service between the Island and the Mainland shall be under one control and management summer and winter meets with pretty general approval. As to company management throughout the year there is less unanimity. There seems a strong conviction that it would not be well to take the winter service out of the hands of the Government lest that body should lose its sense of responsibility. The prevailing opinion so far as we have heard expression of it seems to be that the Government ought to own and operate the ferries connecting its railway lines on the Island and Mainland. It is argued that if any railway company owned these railways it would also, beyond question, own and operate the connecting steamers.

Hon. Mr. Emmerson has spoken out in Parliament in favor of the Cape Route for traffic between this Province and the adjoining Provinces. And at the banquet given in his honor recently in Saint John he strongly favored the Government acquiring and operating the branch lines connecting with the Intercolonial. There are a half dozen or more of these branches including the N. B. and P. E. I. Railway which connects Sackville and Cape Tormentine. All the people on this side of the Strait would be glad to have this branch made a part of the system and to have the terminals at both ends put in order for passenger and freight traffic throughout the year. This would also suit Mr. Emmerson's constituents in Westmoreland.

THE TIME-TABLE. Sr.—I entirely agree with your editorial of the 28th ult. in re Train Service, where you state, "we have another grievance much more serious than the winter timetable. I think if we had all our wants as well supplied as when we have one train a day west of Summerside we would have very little to grumble about. The argument is because other places have got so much accommodation, therefore we are entitled to like accommodation, forgetting that it would be more in the eternal fitness of things to have the train service reduced all round. It has always seemed to me ridiculous and an unnecessary expense to see the express train often coming into Alberton, with perhaps three, two, one, or sometimes no passengers. I think a good deal of the fuss arises from political motives. It is of more importance for us to emphasize the necessity and the right of continuous communication."
