CULINARY MATTERS

PRUNE SAUCE.—Rub stewed prunes through a colander. Make a thin sirup of sugar and orange juice, enough to make the prunes as thin as apple sauce.

APPLE FLOAT.—For a quickly made and dainty dessert mash well sweetened and flavored apple sauce

through a sieve, making it very smooth and thick. Have the whites of two eggs beaten to a stiff froth and fold into the sauce. Set into the ice-box until ready to serve.

CORNMEAL PANCAKES.—These are best made with sour milk or buttermilk. For a pint of sour milk take a teaspoonful of soda and a half teaspoonful of salt.
