Dingwell invited the next Institute to meet at her home at North Lake, on August 5th, at 8 o'clock, the discussion to be plans for future work. After a vote of thanks was tendered to Mrs. Dunbrack and Miss McDonald, the meeting closed.

IN MEMORIAM

MR. CHARLES DEACON

Announcement of the death of Mr. Charles Deacon, which, as briefly reported in the Guardian Friday morning, occurred on Thursday was received with sorrow by his many friends throughout the city. Mr. Deacon, who was a native of England, was for many years a trusted officer of the Bank of British North America. On retiring from active service he took up his residence in Charlottetown. A man of literary tastes and exceedingly well informed on literature, politics and current events, he made a large circle of friends in the city. In his well furnished library kind spirits met at regular intervals to discuss topics of mutual interest and to enjoy his cultured and always interesting conversation. During the last few years he, in addition conducted a literary class for the study of leading authors, his Shakespeare class, perhaps, being the most noted. He was a Conservative in politics and followed closely public affairs both in Canada and in England. He was an occasional contributor to The Guardian and his letters and articles showed keen appreciation of and insight into the public questions of the day. He is survived by Mrs. Deacon, of the Merchants' Band of Commerce, Toronto, who has arrived home. To the bereaved relatives The Guardian tenders deepest sympathy.

The Guardian learns with deep regret of the death of Mrs. Moore, beloved wife of Colonel F. S. Moore, which occurred in this city on Sunday morning, the 2nd inst. Mrs. Moore was born in Charlottetown and was the youngest daughter of the late Mr. John Boyver. She was married in 1871 and leaves to mourn her husband, one son, Mr. Louis A. Moore, District Superintendent of the P. E. I. Telephone Company at Summerside, and one daughter, Mrs. Charles H. Black, of this city; also two widowed sisters, Mrs. John Higgins, and Mrs. (Rev.) F. Smallwood, both residents of Charlottetown. The deceased, during her lifetime, was an active and consistent member of the Methodist Church, and was noted for her benevolence and kindly interest in all who were in need of aid or sympathy. The Guardian extends sincere sympathy to the members of the family and friends.
