The past winter has been a decidedly disappointing one from the standpoint of the iceboat owners of this city. The first factor which tended towards spoiling the iceboating after the ice made was the winter steamer Earl Grey. This steamer ran into this port quite late and kept ice broken up as far as the ferry wharf, making it dangerous as well as too rough for iceboating. The only sport left them was between the Hillsboro Bridge and the Railway Wharf and when about two days of good ice had been enjoyed a succession of rain and snow falls and frosts made the ice unfit for the exhilarating winged runners. With the exception of the two or three days mentioned, no iceboating was had this year and the prospects for any in the near future are slim indeed. However, there are other seasons to come and this thought is commended for the use of those whose feelings are deflected by reason of the few opportunities afforded for iceboating in the season of 1910—11.

FINGER PRINTS HIS BETRAVER

NEW YORK, March 10—The record of a man's life is written on his face, but from three months before birth until death there is no change in his finger prints. To this fact Charles Crisp, arrested last night, owes the action of Magistrate Corrigan today, who held him in \$5000 on charges of burglary.

On Feb. 21, somebody broke into storage rooms at 171 Wooster St. by removing a pane of glass, and stole \$500 worth of goods, but the thief left tell-tale finger prints on the pane. They were photographed, and Lieutenant Faurot, in charge of the police bureau of finger print identification, swore today that the photographs coincided with fresh prints from Crisp's fingers.

"In the five years I have given to this subject," he testified, "I have never known one case where two prints of different fingers resembled each other. There are 27 points of resemblance here. I have even known cases where persons have been identified after death by finger prints. Age and growth expand but do not alter them."

Magistrate Corrigan in holding Crisp said that when the case is heard the verdict will depend wholly on what weight a jury gives to Lieutenant Faurot's testimony.
