Black Hawks Defeat Toronto 5-4 And 4-3

CHICAGO, Nov. 15 (AP)—The Chicago Black Hawks skipped into second place behind the Detroit Red Wings in the National Hockey League race tonight by upsetting the Toronto Maple Leafs 5-4 before a packed house of 16,089 wild fans.

Handing the Stanley Cuppers a defeat for the second consecutive night, the Hawks poured in the winning goal at 17:33 of the final period with veteran Bill Thoms having the honor on assists by the Bentley brothers, Max and Doug.

Canadiens Lose Two Games To Red Wings

DETROIT, Nov. 15 (AP)—The Detroit Red Wings tightened their hold tonight on the National Hockey League leadership by scoring two third period goals to defeat Montreal Canadiens, 3-1 before 12,491 spectators, largest crowd of the young season here.

The top Detroit line of Don Grosso, Sid Abel and Eddie Wares, evidently just getting into hgh gear, scored, each using a goal. Abel's first period shot matched Gordon Drillon's goal that put Montreal in front after one minute of play, and Grosso and Wares connected 35 seconds apart in the third period.

The victory, second straight for Detroit over Montreal in the weekend series, was Detroit's fourth in six games.

Only in the first period were the Canadiens a threat to goalie Johnny Mowers of Detroit. The veteran Drillon skated in superbly and feinted the goalie out of the cage to fire home a blistering shot for Montreal's lone score.

The Canadiens had only 12 players in uniform, four others having been stopped at the border by immigration regulations. There was only one extra defenceman and when Jack Portland went out for repairs in the third period it left the club with only Leo Lamoureux and Tony Graboski as defenders.
