## PARENTS FOUND GUILTY OF MANSLAUGHTER

VALLEYFIELD, Que., Feb. 7. —Edouard Groleau and his wife tonight awaited sentence after being found guilty of manslaughter by a jury in the Court of King's Bench. The jury heard their trial on a charge of murdering their six-year-old daughter, Laura, and brought in a conviction on the lower charge.

The parents of the child, who died at St. Antoine, Que., on April 15, 1934 of pneumonia brought about according to Crown contentions of prolonged ill treatment, were recommended to the clemency board of the court and will be sentenced Feb. 13.

Evidence at the three-day trial showed Laura had been confined to the wall of the house, refused food and water, beaten with leather straps, forced to sleep the floor without any covering and sent out into the bitter cold to wash her only dress while standing naked and barefooted. She then had to put the dress on while it was still wet. Medical evidence submitted showed the back of her left leg had been cut down to the tendon and the wound could have been caused by the constant rubbing of a chain.

Witnesses testified little Laura was forced to wash the floor and when she evaded the eye of her mother she drank the dirty water from the pail. One night she drank a can of coal oil which had been left out by her parents "to see what she would do." Her hair had been pulled out in patches and she was covered with bruises and sores.

The Crown closed its case with the testimony of detective Ernest Dion and Constable Maurice Dion of the Provincial Police. They held the Court broke up in statements made to them stated the girl had been chained to the wall at the St. Armande home in the same manner she had been chained at Rockland, Que., where the family formerly resided.
