British And Nazis Clash

PARIS, March 5.—(CP) —A clash between British and German troops, in which one German and two Britons were killed and British prisoners were taken was announced tonight in the first communique on western front action to be issued by the British expeditionary force headquarters in France. While the new lull prevailed elsewhere along the front, German troops this morning attacked a British front line post, taking a number of prisoners, the communique said. The Britons recaptured the post and forced the enemy to withdraw. In addition to those killed, one Briton was wounded.

National Government Program With War Help Paramount Appeals To All Canadians

A program for Canada's National Government, headed by Hon. Dr. Manion, leader of the National Conservative Party, who plans to unite all factions in the Dominion for a vigorous war and peace effort, follows: 1.—Exertion of every effort by Canada toward the successful prosecution of the war. 2.—Full mobilization of Canada's resources. 3.—Production in Canada of all war materials possible. 4.—Closest possible co-operation with Great Britain. 5.—Immediate appointment of overseas minister to remain in England. 6.—Encouragement of voluntary recruiting, which has been discouraged. 7.—Fullest possible use of offers of service from veterans of last war. 8.—No political patronage or favoritism in appointments or war contracts. 9.—No profiteering or exploitation. 10.—Stamping out extravagance and waste. 11.—Just and honorable treatment for all dependents of enlisted men, and fair treatment of enlisted men in pay, allowances and pensions. 12.—Closest co-operation with Great Britain and other parts of the Empire in air training schemes. 13.—Proper co-ordination of all wartime boards and commissions, now functioning without necessary co-ordination. 14.—Immediate review of censorship and other restrictive regulations, and steps to keep people of Canada fully informed of war effort. 15.—Immediate action, including appointment of minister of youth welfare, to meet problems of unemployment. 16.—Implementation of most recommendations of the Purvis-Moore commission on employment.
