**GIRLS' COATS 1/3 OFF**

**Belfast And Vicinity**

A short time ago an account appeared in the columns of this paper regarding the new store lately opened at Pinetoe by Mr. George E. Docherty and today nothing remains of that lovely building but the concrete foundation. The fire which has already been reported and swept everything so quickly, was discovered early Saturday morning Feb. 5th, by Mrs. Docherty who heard a crackling sound and in a few seconds the fire had burst through the walls at the foot of her bed. Mr. Docherty's first thought was for the safety of the other occupants of his home and after waking same hastened to carry his aged invalid aunt to safety which he did with great risk of his own life having his hair badly scorched in coming down the

stairs. His presence of mind in such an emergency of covering her with a blanket before leaving her room was the means of her getting out without being burned. Mrs. Buchanan was removed at once to the home of friends and although suffering from shock was at the time of writing as well as could be expected.

Mr. Andrew Hutcheson, who has been a valued employee of Mr. Docherty for some time, assisted greatly in saving the few articles that are left and at great risk. The last time he came out of the burning building he had to be given first aid to get him back to normal. Mr. Hutcheson lost all his personal belongings except the scanty apparel he had on at the time, as did also Mr. and Mrs. Docherty.

Miss Leitha Murphy, of MacNeill's Mills who was Mrs. Buchanan's nurse was of great assistance in this crisis. Mr. Docherty's oldest child aged 3 in some unknown way got badly cut and it necessitated calling Dr. Johnson at once to put five stitches in the wound. She is doing nicely. The other two children aged 20 months and 3 months were removed by the mother who escaped in night clothes but who had the presence of mind to snatch her winter coat when passing through the hall on the way out. Mr. Docherty lost \$310 in cash, same being in his pocket where it was packed ready to be taken to the city in the morning, also many valuable things that money couldn't buy. Some gold pieces that were wedding gifts were also lost. Of interest to Mr. Docherty's overseas

friends will be his finding in the collar after the fire a can that contained the bullet that went through his jaw in France. His face still shows the scar. A small quantity of furniture was saved but some was scorched after being taken from the building. A large quantity of tinware and weaver utensils also a large order of drugs were lost by the new store being burned. Much sympathy is being shown to Mr. Docherty and family by helping in any way possible

and all feel grateful he and his family came through such a trying experience as well as they did.
