Meatless Days For Toronto

TORONTO, April 25 — (CP) — Thousands of homes in Toronto went meatless today as only small quantities of cattle were reported to be arriving in abattoirs in the Queen city.

Robert McCubbin, the Liberal member of Parliament for Etobicoke West, said that large packing houses were responsible for the situation, because of their lowering bids for live cattle. J. S. McLean, president of Canada Packers, declared that with no ceiling prices set for live cattle, the packers were losing money and would not continue to buy the animals at the prevailing high prices.

Retirement Of Brigadier Keating

OTTAWA, April 25 — (CP) — The retirement of Brigadier R.J.B. Keating, O.B.E. of Halifax, Deputy Quartermaster General, was announced by National Defence Headquarters today.

He has served since December, 1936, first as an embarkation staff officer in Siberia. He was an expert in movement control (concerned with despatch overseas of all troops and their later arrival home). In 1940, he received his present rank and assumed the appointment he now relinquishes. He has been overseas a number of times on duty.

Byrnes Concerned Over Possibilities At Peace Conference

WASHINGTON, April 25 — (AP) — Secretary of State James Byrnes leaves for Paris today gravely aware of the possibilities of failure at the forthcoming Peace Conference.

Some of his closest associates and advisers consider the meeting a possible turning point and suggest it actually could mark the end of efforts by Britain, Russia and the United States to work harmoniously for European peace settlements and their efforts to build the United Nations into a powerful agency.

Should events take such a turn, it might result in the unlinited creation of spheres of influence and link Britain and the United States even more tightly in common interests and policies.

Ousting Germans From Baltic Port

STETTIN, April 25 — (CP) — Poles in this once great German Baltic seaport were working hard to expel the city's 30,000 remaining Germans to Allied zones of occupation and to speed reconstruction here.

Almost every day, vessels arrive from German ports, bringing back upwards of 2,000 Poles. Within 48 hours the ships are headed back to Germany, carrying German repatriates and their families. There now are 40,000 Poles in Stettin but a population of around 100,000 Poles was anticipated before the end of the year.
