TORONTO, September 3.—For the first time in its history the anti-saloon league is holding its meeting on Canadian soil, the first session having opened this morning at the Alumni building of Victoria College.

Montague, formerly of the British army, who was charged with the murder of a Manchester merchant named Dayan in a hotel here August 11th, was tried today by a jury made up of five British residents and acquitted.
