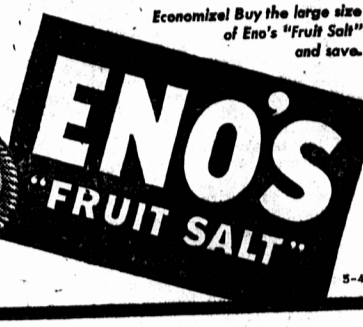

Woodside's Variety Store Opening Saturday Morning

—The opening takes place on Saturday morning of Woodside's 5 to 100 Variety Store in the Lidstone Building on Water Street, Summerside. Operated by Mr. Carl Woodside who has three years' experience in this type of business with Steedman's Ltd., this locally owned store should be an important addition to the shopping district of the town. The interior of the store is 68 feet long by 22 feet wide with three rows of attractively arranged counters and double aisles.

He will carry a full stock of candy, hosiery, dry goods, glassware, stationery, notions, tin and enamelware, men's wear, woodenware, toilet goods, shelf hardware and toys. His main supplier sells goods to over 200 independent stores, which indicates that this store has a large chain store. Mirrors are placed on the four sides of the center posts of the store, giving a pleasing effect. The color scheme is cream and brown with black trimmings. The lighting is supplied by fluorescent fixtures and a new type of cash register will be in use. The front exterior of the store has been attractively painted and over the entrance there is a large new neon sign with red and green colors predominating.
