TORONTO, July 14—(CP)—More gains than losses were registered on the Toronto stock exchange in the final session of the week and turnover was 50,000 shares.
Home Oil was in demand at 155, up 4 cents. Calmont and Pacific Petroleum were slightly stronger.
Mining index gains were netted by both mining groups and the industrial. Gains of a point showed for Bell Telephone, Consumers Gas and Gaitaneau Power pd. Walkers Comm. gained 1-8 while Ford A posted a gain of 3-8 and Distillers-Sea-grains 3-8.
Gold stocks firmed 1/2 in the index. Kerr-Addison firmed 6 cents. Bralorne was up 15 cents, and a gain of a few cents were netted by Chesterville, Hollinger, Little Long Lac, MacLeod-Cockshutt and Pickle Crow. Teck Hughes weakened 5 cents.
Sherritt was up a cent.

FINANCE

NEW YORK, July 14—(AP)—In one of the slowest half-dozen sessions of the past 22 years, the stock market Saturday staggered out of a foggy week without displaying any real sense of direction.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged at 41.1 and, on the week, was off 2. The composite also held at dead centre on the preceding Tuesday. Wednesday's gains of 1-8 were netted by Monday and as much Friday. Out of 1233 listed issues only 371 changed hands today. Of these, 126 were up, 102 down and 143 at where they finished Friday.
Transactions in 124,050 shares, while one of the low tides since 1918, actually touched a new bottom since July 8, 1939. The volume on the previous Saturday was 131,879 shares.
Among the day's minor gainers were General Motors, U. S. Rubber, Boeing Douglas Aircraft, Southern Pacific, Homestake Mining, American Telephone and North American.
Packard moved up a fraction. Unchanged to down a shade were U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Anaconda, Johns-Manville, Texas, Corp., Western Union and Great Northern.
Among the Canadian section, Dome and Canadian Pacific showed fractional gains while other issues were inactive. In the bond market Canada 4s were unchanged.

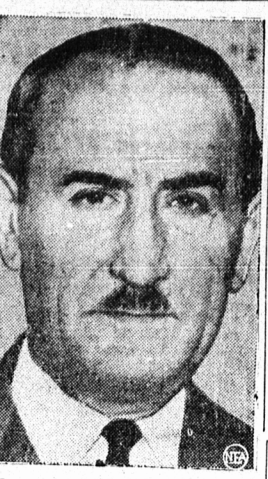

Six Lose Lives In Conflagration

CINCINNATI, July 12—(AP)—Cincinnati's worst institutional fire in nearly 30 years killed six women residents of the Holy Family Home today and authorities, listing property damage at \$50,000, launched immediate search for a suspected incendiary.
The state fire marshal's office entered the inquiry after home altitudes told Fire Chief B. J. Houston they had been recently troubled by prowlers.
At least seven persons—five police and firemen and two women residents of the Catholic home for the aged and infirm—were injured.
Thirty other residents were rescued.

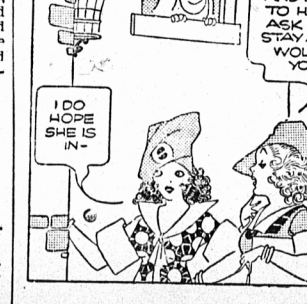

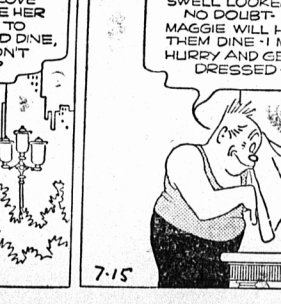
