God bless you! Have just learned of the home going of "Mother" Horns, and want to express my sympathy to you all in this hour of your grief and loneliness. Ever since Dan informed us of the seriousness of her sickness we have had more than ordinary concern for her welfare and yours. It hardly seems possible that the end could come so quickly. How much she must have borne that none but herself and her Saviour knew.

After receiving Jennie's letter I presented her cause in one of our prayer meetings and we had a very gracious time as we plead her needs at the throne of Grace. While we could not feel that Christ had promised to restore health and prolong life in the already worn and weather-beaten temple, yet we had no question as to the security of the spirit that we knew was rejoicing in the God of her salvation. In fact it seemed almost cruel to insist that the joys of a future life with Jesus be delayed her through additional lingering upon the shores of time in a world of weariness and pain.

However, I shall always remember "mother" Horns as one who never tired in seeking the happiness and comfort of others and believe that to her has come the "well done!" because "Inasmuch as she has done it unto one of the least of these she has done it unto Christ."
