A telegram has been received in Charlottetown from the National Trotting Association stating that the appeal of the owners of the horse Krenmut from the decision of the judges at the horse races held on the track of the Charlottetown Driving Park in starting a race without waiting for that horse had been disallowed and the ruling of the judges sustained by the Board of Review of the National Trotting Association. The horse Krenmut had been entered in the 2:20 Trot—Stake race called for the 28th of September last, but when the race was called that horse did not appear before the judges' stand as soon as the other horses entered and the judges started the race without him. His owner entered a protest which went before the Board of Review and the hearing came off at New York on Thursday last and that Board held that the judges of the Charlottetown races were right in starting the race without Krenmut and affirmed their decision and dismissed the owner's appeal.
