It sold at 45c, with potatoes at 60c to 65c. Some young pigs sold at from \$9.50 to \$11 a pair. The hide market continued slow, hides selling at 5c. Noticeable in Mr. Stephen Brown's stall were ten very choice lambs. The other stalls also had a good display.
