When one comes to think of it there is very little cause for all the apprehension that has been entertained regarding the future of the Canadian Woman's Council. It is only because of the exceptional advantages the Council has heretofore enjoyed that its prospects look a little dark now. It may not accomplish so much without Lady Aberdeen as if did under her able guidance, but there is no reason for supposing that its usefulness, will be seriously impaired. Lady Aberdeen has imbued her followers with much of her own spirit, and many of them have exhibited such ability and devotion in their work that a body which had never had a Countess of Aberdeen would consider itself fortunate in the possession of such leaders. Then there is the happy combination of high social position with more practical qualifications in the new president, Lady Edgar, and the particularly fortunate choice of Miss Wilson, the present secretary of the International Council, and formerly Lady Aberdeen's private secretary. All this, with the new central office, the assurance of the secretary's salary for three years, and the continued interest and support of Lady Aberdeen herself, ought to be a sufficient guarantee against failure.

TRADE AND SHIPPING

PORT OF CHARLOTTETOWN.

The Quebec department of agriculture has issued a bulletin on the crops in the province based on 799 reports from different parts of the country, dating from the end of September and the beginning of October. The report is a very satisfactory one, and the number representing the average condition of the crops is much higher than that of last year at the same date, which was only 61, while this year the figure has risen to 79. The highest average this year is obtained from clover, and the lowest from buckwheat, rye and potatoes. Fodder crops have a higher average generally than roots or grain, which is precisely the reverse of last year.

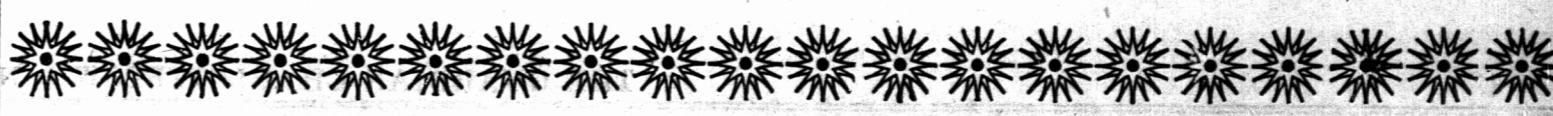

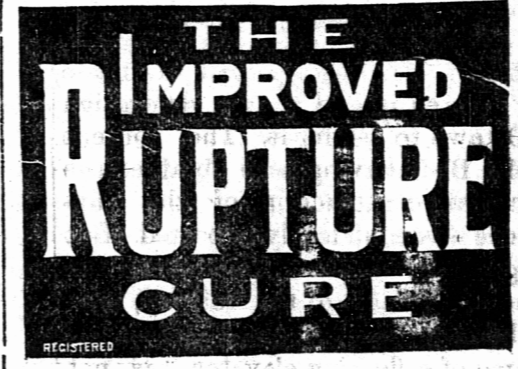

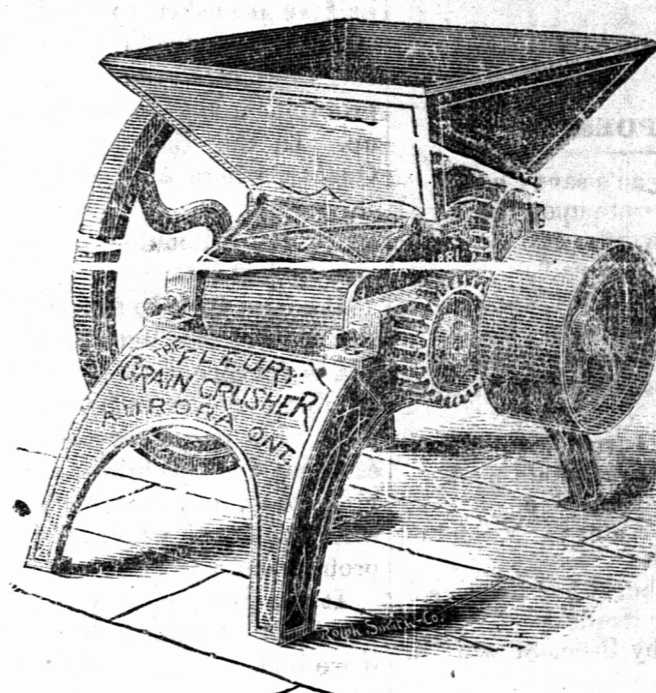
