MONTREAL, March 4 (CP)—Receipts on the Montreal livestock market today were: cattle 478; calves 437; sheep 84; hogs 1,222; the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.
Steers and medium cows were firm to 25 cents higher. Calves were 25 to 50 cents higher and other stock steady.
Good steers made \$7.25 to \$7.75 with odd top steers up to \$8. Medium steers were from \$6.25 to \$7.25 and common steers from \$5 to \$6.25. Several fed calves or baby beefs were sold at \$7 to \$9 per cwt. Heifers ranged from \$4 to \$7. Good cows were \$5.50 to \$5.75, medium \$4.50 to \$5.25 and common \$4 to \$4.50. Canners and cutters were \$3 to \$3.75. Bologna bulls \$4.25 to \$5.25 and butcher bulls \$5.50 to \$6.
Veal calves were about 25 to 50 cents higher than the close of the week. Good quality veals made \$10.90. Medium to medium good kind in mixed lots at \$10. Commoner kinds from \$8 to \$9.50 with the bulk between \$9 and \$9.50. Drinkers were \$5 to \$7.50 and grassers \$4.25 to \$4.60.
Six early lambs averaging around 47 pounds were sold at \$10 each. Last year's crop were mostly bucks and brought \$9.50 to \$10 per cwt, according to quality. Sheep were \$3 to \$6.
Hogs were mostly \$9.35 to \$9.40 for bacon fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Sows were \$6 to \$6.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.30 to \$12.40 hot weight.

Crew Of Nova Scotia Schooner Are Rescued

NEW YORK, March 3 (AP)—The Swedish cargo freighter Sagoland docked yesterday with the skipper and five members of the 170-ton three-masted Nova Scotia schooner A. W. Chisholm rescued after 14 days of drifting in their waterlogged craft 300 miles east of Bermuda.
The Chisholm which carried neither wireless nor auxiliary engine, left Sheburne, N. S., Feb. 7 with a cargo of lumber for the Barbadoes and immediately ran into dirty weather.
"We took an awful beating from the start," Captain George H. Corum said last week at sea. "The old ship's seams began to spring. We were soon waterlogged."
For the next two weeks they just drifted virtually without food and water. The men slept, when they could, on deck. Two ships were sighted, both passed by.
Last Thursday Burns, 19 youngest member of the crew, saw a light.
"We blipped around," said Capt. Corum, "and found a drum of gasoline lashed to the deck. We got a stick of wood and then Gordon Acker took off his overcoat and we soaked it and lit it. The next thing we saw was the Sagoland bearing down on us."
The seas were too rough for a rescue and the Sagoland had to stand by for 36 hours for better weather. "The men were finally taken off Thursday."

Nova Scotian Legislature To Open Tuesday

HALIFAX, N. S., March 3 (CP)—Opening of the third session of the 18th Nova Scotia legislative assembly since confederation, on Tuesday, will provide a touch believed unique in the history of the province. Because of the illness of Lieut. Gov. Robert Irwin, the province's administrator and chief justice Sir Joseph Chisholm, will read the speech from the throne.
Lieut. Gov. Irwin has been ill for some time and Sir Joseph has been sworn in to administer the affairs of the province in his stead. It is believed this is the first time an administrator has officiated at the opening of the house.
Missing from the usual colorful opening will be the red, gold-braided military uniforms and the booming of cannon from historic Citadel Hill. Warding off the threat will be the order for the guard-of-honor drawn up in front of the province house.
The familiar faces will be missing from the 30-member house due to Canada's wartime election. Dr. M. E. McGarry, who was elected speaker last year, has resigned. The federal riding of Inverness-Richmond.
Conservative house leader since 1937, Percy C. Black will be missing from the opposition ranks. He has resigned his seat for the provincial constituency of Cumberland to contest the same riding in the dominion election.
