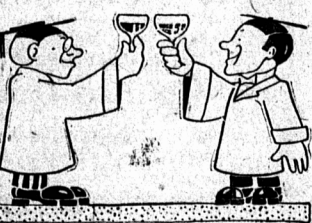

THE INWARD TRAINS.—The southern accommodation arrived in Charlottetown yesterday at 10.45 a. m., thirty minutes late; the Cape Traverse accommodation at 11.05 a. m., fifty-five minutes late; the eastern accommodation at 11.35 a. m., thirty minutes late; the western accommodation at 1.10 p. m., fifty minutes late and the Summerside accommodation at 6.05 p. m., fifty minutes late. The mail special from Georgetown arrived at 12.30 p. m.

FISH AND GAME ASSO.—The quarterly meeting of the Fish and Game Association was held in the Stipendiary Magistrate's court room last night and was adjourned on account of the weather preventing a number of the country members from being present. It was decided to hold the meeting at a later date as there are matters of importance to be discussed and a large meeting is desired. Due notice of the meeting will be given.

DEAD IN MONTREAL.—An old resident of Montreal, Lemuel Craig Schurman, died yesterday at the home of his daughter, 166 Atwater avenue, Westmont, after a brief illness. Mr. Schurman was born at Bedeque, P. E. I., 65 years ago, and was closely related to President Schurman, of Cornell University. There survive his widow and two daughters, Mrs. R. E. Matthews, and Mrs. Thomas G. Hodge. The funeral will be held to-morrow afternoon. Montreal Star, March 4th.

DUNCAN MCKEOWN.—The people of West River were greatly grieved to learn of the unexpected death of Duncan McKewen, one of the well-known and highly respected citizens, who passed away on Monday morning, March 3rd. Deceased who had been ill for a very short time, was in his sixtieth year. He was a son of John McKewen, well known to the older residents of Long Creek. Mr. McKewen, Sr., died about forty-eight years ago, leaving Duncan, then a lad of two, and his widowed mother, to look after the farm. He proved to be an industrious, steady and successful farmer. He took an active interest in all measures tending to advance the interests of his native place, was a kind neighbor, devoted father and tender husband. He leaves to mourn a widow and family, who longingly tended him during his last illness. Of a family of seven, two sons, Daniel and Anson, and two daughters, Bertha and Isabella, are at home. The others who are in Western Canada, are Herbert, Albert and Dalziel. The funeral which took place to the New Dominion Presbyterian cemetery, was one of the largest ever seen in that section of the country.—Rev. A. Craize officiated at the funeral service.

FURTHER PARTICULARS.—Some additional facts concerning the death of Harry Westaway, the Georgetown man killed in British Columbia, as referred to recently, have been ascertained. Mr. Westaway had been engaged in painting for some time past. In a letter received last week by his mother, he stated that as the work was being held up by the wet season, he intended to join a party of special constables, who were going north to Union Bay to round up a gang of burglars, who had been operating there. The next news came in despatches received by his brother-in-law, J. D. Stewart of Georgetown, and by Dr. McLaughlin of St. Peter's stating that he had been shot by burglars. The remains will probably be interred in Vancouver under the direction of the Masons. The news of the affair has caused sorrow and regret in Georgetown and other places where the deceased was well known. He was a young man of many excellent qualities of mind and heart. For a number of years he was connected with the militia, being first a member of the Georgetown artillery company, and later of the Montague Company. He was one of the best gun layers in the Fourth Regiment, and was a member of the team, sent from P. E. Island to the Old Country about two years ago. He was of a genial, optimistic temperament, and very popular with his associates. He was the son of the late John Westaway, who died several months ago. He leaves a mother, one brother, William in Glace Bay, C. B., and one sister, Mrs. J. D. Stewart, of Georgetown, to mourn his loss.
