SUMMER SCHOOL OF SCIENCE MEET

Report of The Opening Proceedings From The Guardian's Special Correspondent

Tuesday the 3rd inst sent your correspondent on his way to the Summer School of Science. His Honor Lieut Governor McKinnon was also a passenger on his way to the school. For the first time in the history of the school the representatives of royalty have deemed the school of sufficient importance to leave their homes and travel a considerable distance that they might assist by their presence and address the work of the school. This year Governor Fraser of Nova Scotia and Governor McKinnon were both in attendance.
 The trip to Cape Breton was an enjoyable one, although the country travelled through both in Nova Scotia and Cape Breton did not compare very favorably with Prince Edward Island as an agricultural country. There is scenery that the Island cannot produce but there is a absence of that luxuriance of crop for which the Island is so noted.

EDITOR'S MAIL.
THE PROVINCIAL EXAMINATION.

Sir,—Your explanation of the question which I have raised in reference to the large percentage of failures at the recent provincial examinations is not, in my opinion, an entirely satisfactory one. For it leads one to infer that all the students who took the provincial examinations had failed a week or two previously at those of Prince of Wales College, which is not so. Besides, the average of 66% is required at Prince of Wales College in order to obtain a certificate, whereas 60% is required to pass the provincial examinations. There were no doubt students at Prince of Wales College who obtained between 60 and 65% at the examinations of that institution and who therefore might reasonably be expected to pass at the other examination. Also, even if there were no difference in the percentage required at both those examinations, a student who had failed at one might pass at the other and vice versa.
 Your explanation shows why we might expect relatively a smaller percentage of successful candidates at the provincial examinations than at those of the Prince of Wales College, but it does not, for example, explain why 100% failed to obtain first-class licenses this year.
 My intention in raising this question is not to impugn the examiners, but to call attention to a condition of things which appears to have prevailed at these examinations for the past few years.
 A number of years ago, even after certificates from Prince of Wales College entitled one to teach without further examination, the pass list of candidates who took the provincial examination was a creditable one. Within the past few years that list is continually dwindling. Take, for example, the pass list for first-class licenses. If my memory serves me, one year one passed, another year two, this year none. It would seem as if the privilege of obtaining a first-class license at the provincial examinations will soon be, if not already, a thing of the past. It is a little better as far as second-class licenses are concerned. Although the percentage of failures is not so heavy as in the other, it seems to me to be excessive.
 Now, to an outsider like myself, who has no other date to guide him but those published pass lists, it leads one to think that the number of failures is greater than it should be. No doubt a satisfactory explanation can be offered, but to me for one it seems incredible that year after year, all those unsuccessful candidates have failed through lack of knowledge.

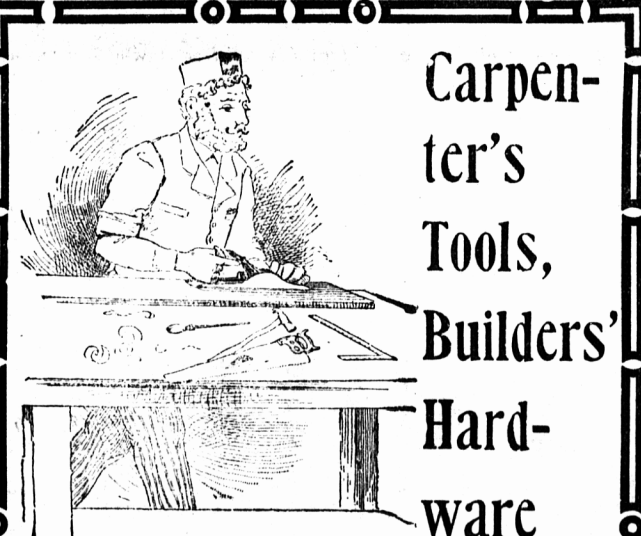
