SUPREME COURT OPENS - The June term of the Supreme Court opens at the Court House, Summerside this morning at eleven o'clock. Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell will preside. There are several criminal cases on the docket but the case of the King vs. Andrew Perry, charged with conspiracy, remains to be heard. This is a new trial which has been ordered by the Court of Criminal Appeals after an appeal had been brought by the prosecution which had been found "not guilty" by a jury. There are also three appeals to be disposed of under the Justice Act.

The communique issued by Royal Chamberlain Ernest Urdreanu, was published in newspapers here today. It spoke of France as Carol's "second land."

New Contract For S'side Dehydration Factory

700 Tons Processed Spuds Turned Out Last Year; Represented 250 Carlots Raw Tubers.

Over seven hundred tons of dehydrated products were turned out in the season just completed at the dehydration plant at Summerside which is operated by Island Foods Ltd. and a contract has been signed to manufacture approximately thirty percent more of this product next season. It was revealed last evening to a representative of this paper by Mr. Austin A. Scates, president of the company and Mr. L. E. Allen, Summerside secretary. The seven hundred tons manufactured represents 250 standard cars of potatoes. To give an example of what that means in terms of transportation, if those carlots had been shipped off the Island by the car ferry, another important matter in connection with this year's production that was mentioned was that the output tested over ninety nine percent fancy grade. This product is packed in 30 pound cartons and was all sold to the British Ministry of Food. During the period of operation from September 19 to June 3, an average of 175 people were employed and the announcement that the plant will operate next season with a greater output will be welcome news to many people. During the season help was scarce coming on spring but sufficient during the winter. Mr. Scates states that the excellent record of production achieved is due in great part to the co-operation of the employees. Mr. Scates and Mr. Allen have just returned from a trip to Montreal and Ottawa. While away Mr. Allen attended a short course on dehydration.

King Haakon Leaves London For Norway

LONDON, June 4 - (CP) - King Haakon left London for Norway tonight, ending five years of rule-in-exile after German occupation of his kingdom.

The monarch will arrive in Oslo tonight, marking the 40th anniversary of Norway's complete break from Sweden.

Accompanying King Haakon are his daughters-in-law, the Crown Princess Martha, and her children, the Princesses Ragnhild and Astrid, and Prince Harald.

The Crown Princess and her children lived at Bethesda, Md. during the war. They arrived in London three weeks ago. King Haakon's wartime residence, secret until now, was an estate near Windsor Castle in an area to which a number of Germany buzz bombs penetrated.

King Haakon, born Prince Carl of Denmark and chosen in 1905 by the Norwegian people to be their monarch, escaped to Britain after constant German attempts to kill him by bombing.
